

# WEDDING MUSIC GUIDELINES (as of 1/1/2017)

Please read the following guidelines with an open mind and heart, mindful that the presence of Christ is central to your wedding ceremony and that the music should add beauty and dignity to the celebration as it brings woman, man and God together through the witness of the Holy Spirit.

Music is a basic, central, and integral part of Catholic Worship, and so it should be for the wedding liturgy as well. Music is not a frill, but a basic and important element that cannot be overlooked. The most important moments for music in the wedding celebration are the times for congregational song and participation. Unfortunately, in rare cases, that is sometimes the last type of music couples consider.

The music during your wedding liturgy is the time for those who gather to celebrate with you and rejoice in song. Allowing musicians to "perform" all the music at is not compatible with Catholic liturgy. Choosing songs and refrains the assembly can sing and printing the song numbers from the hymnal in your Order of Worship will allow the assembly to express their joy and participate more fully in the liturgy.

#### When selecting music for your wedding, there are three basic criteria:

It is important, when possible, that the music includes the assembly.
 The music must fit the spirit and structure of the liturgy. The text should come from scripture or reflect the sentiment of binding woman, man and God as one.
 Music must be considered standard repertoire and of appropriate content.

Solo music may include: (a) preludes, limited to three selections, (b) a unity candle song (if used) and (c) the Ave Maria at the Dedication to the Blessed Virgin Mary (if used).

The music must fit the context of faith and the dignity of the occasion. The texts should speak of a Christian concept of love and marriage, not a physical or romantic one. Every generation has its love songs, and some of them are great music. They may have a place in your wedding day, but that place in not at your wedding liturgy. This includes most secular music.

It is the policy of St. Saint Francis that the Director of Music & Liturgy and a parish cantor are selected to provide music for your celebration. They are most familiar with our liturgical rites, music, and acoustical environment. Any guest musicians, which may add to the celebration, are required to adhere to our parish wedding music guidelines, and must work directly with the Director of Music and Liturgy.

#### Base musician and church fees:

Church Facility Fee: **\$175 (Parish member), \$300 (Non-parishioner)**. This fee is due at the time the church is booked.

Directory of Music & Liturgy/Organist, Pianist– \$250 (This fee is due at the wedding planning meeting)

Cantor/Song-leader/Psalmist – \$150.

Wedding Coordinator: \$150.

Other fees are due, in the form of separate checks, thirty days (30 days) before your wedding and may be delivered to the parish office to the attention of the Director of Music & Liturgy, Michael Deane c/o Saint Francis de Sales, 148 West Main Street Lake Geneva, WI 53147.

You must make an appointment with Michael Deane, our Director of Music and Liturgy prior to your wedding date. Please feel free to email him with any questions or concerns you may have <u>liturgy@sfdslg.org</u> or call (262) 248-1680.

Other notes for the ceremony:

- 1. Flower arrangements can be used but they are to not block the altar and nothing that is already in place may be moved.
- 2. No flowers (real or silk) can be thrown onto the floor. We cannot make any exceptions. This also includes throwing flowers outside of the church building.
- 3. Photographers are to refrain from being anywhere in the altar area. This is a sacred space and needs to be treated in such a way. They are welcome use the space in the balcony to take pictures.
- 4. Only bubbles can be used outside of the church as the bride and groom are exiting the building. Please no birdseed or rice.
