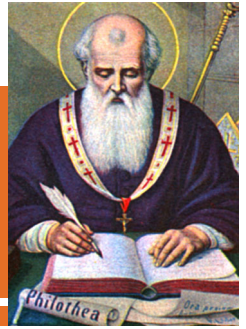

LAS POSADAS AT SFDS

Las Posadas is a nine-day celebration celebrated chiefly in Mexico and by Mexican-Americans every evening beginning Dec. 16 and ending Dec. 24. A 400 year old tradition, two people dress up as Mary and Joseph.

Certain houses are designated to be an "inn". The head of the procession will have a candle inside a paper lampshade. At each house, the resident responds by singing a song and Mary and Joseph are finally recognized and allowed to enter. Once the "innkeepers" let them in, the group of guests come into the home and kneel around the Nativity scene to pray (typically, the Rosary).

Individuals may actually play the various parts of Mary (María) and Joseph with attendants such as angels and shepherds acquired along the way, or the pilgrims may carry images of the holy personages instead. The procession will be followed by musicians, with the entire procession singing posadas such as pedir posada. At the end of each night's journey, there will be Christmas carols (villancicos), children will break open star-shaped piñatas to obtain candy and fruit hidden inside, and there will be a feast.

SFDS 2015 YEAR-END SUMMARY

2015 was a year of growth for St. Francis de Sales. Our internal and outreach programs are growing, and it's no coincidence that the spirit of our parish grew as well! Jim Schuerman, works tirelessly in his role, creating meaningful liturgies and homilies, counseling the distressed, teaching, greeting, leading, administering sacraments, and yes attending many evening meetings. His passion to work with our Hispanic community has brought new life and communication to bring us together. Our staff members, Michael Deane, Director of Liturgy and Music, Eric Gallagher, Parish School Principal, Katie Ploch, Director of Religious Education, Judie Weeks, Office Manager, and Mike Johnson, Head Custodian, have created a cohesive team. Rooted in faith, they are all bringing new energy and ideas, working above and beyond to bring excellence to their programs with humor and grace. SFDS is so fortunate to have such a talented staff that is passionate in the vision of the future of our parish!

2015 was a busy year! 47 babies were baptized, 29 wedding ceremonies united couples in marriage, 23 young adults experienced the Holy Spirit through confirmation, 61 children received their first Communion, countless confessions were heard, and 6 Hispanic girls upheld the tradition of the quinceañera. Many of the sick (67 people) were anointed, and 27 families were comforted in their grieving as they memorialized a loved one. On Holy Saturday, 6 new members were welcomed into the Catholic Faith. Our many ministries are expanding and flourishing with over 500 volunteers. Our school is vibrant with 167 students from 3 year old pre-school through 8th grade, and 220 students learn more about their faith each week through the outreach of our Religious Education/Youth Ministry Programs.

If you are a volunteer, THANK YOU for the many things that you do. If you not are currently part of a program but would like to share your time and talent, I encourage you to start NOW in this New Year! Stop by the office to pick up a ministry booklet that outlines all of the ways you can volunteer, or visit our website and click on the "How to Get Involved" tab. In both places you will find detailed information on our many ministries and groups, as well as who to contact to sign up. I would be happy to help you find the best fit.

Looking forward, we will be embarking on a Church Restoration project this spring, with a capital campaign kick-off coming soon. Our historic church building, constructed in 1892, needs some updating and refurbishing.
