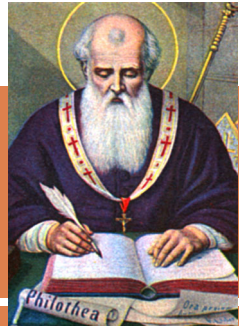

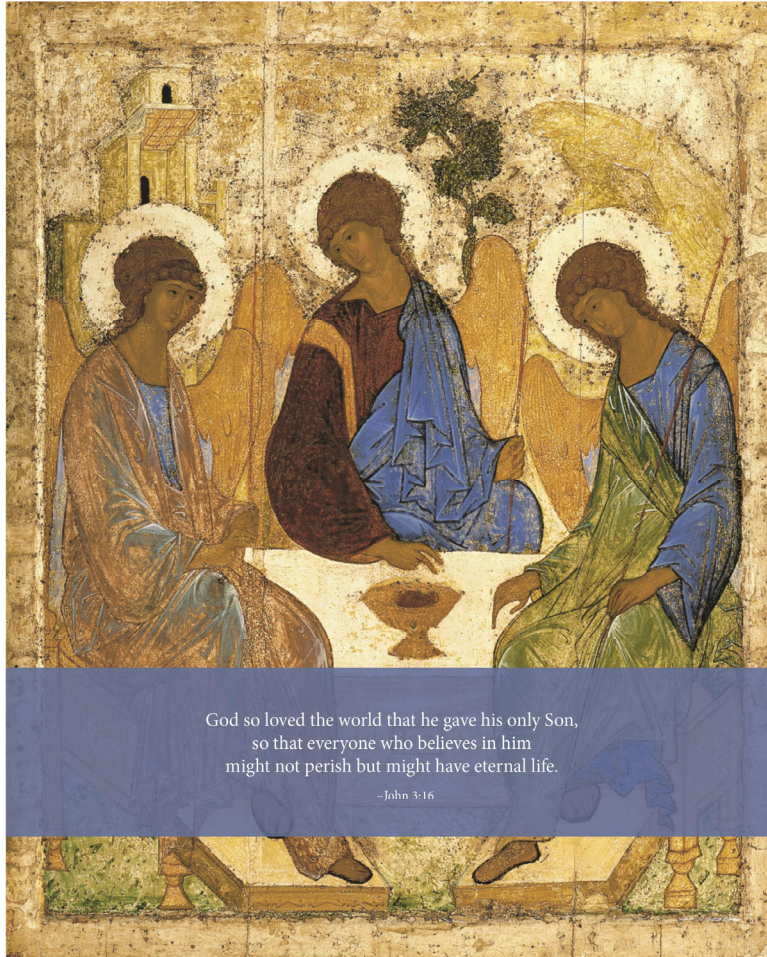

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Francis de Sales Church,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity - it is a celebration of the great mystery of God in our lives. Our God as revealed to us in Scripture is Father, Son and Spirit: one God, three persons. We learn from the Sacred Scriptures that within God's very self there is a relationship of love between Father, Son and Holy Spirit, a relationship so profound and so vast that it cannot be contained. That love engulfs and penetrates every aspect of our lives.

In the moment of our baptism, these words are spoken: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." We come into this world knowing no one, and we are alone and vulnerable in many ways. But in the moment of baptism, the God of love reaches out to us, and invites us into the life of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, showing us that we are not alone, that we are profoundly loved, and giving us the grace to be instruments of love and compassion in this world.

The Scriptures teach us that God's love is without limits and that he holds nothing back from us. He sent his only Son, not to condemn us but to give us eternal life. And the Son held nothing back; he loved us to the full extent and died to release us from our slavery to sin. In his resurrection we have new life. The Holy Spirit transforms us into instruments of God's love in this world. May that love be revealed in our works of mercy!

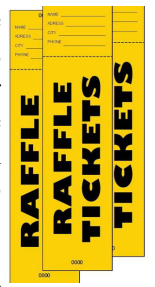

LETTER FROM FATHER GARY

Have you ever been captivated by the life of a saint or the lives of the saints? Well, you are certainly not alone. The saints are a rich and important part of our Catholic tradition. Their lives, joys, struggles, prayers, writings and examples of love and courage can inform and enrich our lives of faith today. And, of course, we have their prayers of intercession.

In this article today I wanted to mention St. Stephen of Hungary and a letter that he wrote to his teenage son. St. Stephen became king of Hungary in the year 1000 and ruled justly and peacefully for 38 years. He died just short of his seventieth birthday. His feastday is on Aug. 16, the day after the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Aug. 15).

In the letter, St. Stephen gave his son advise and counsel on how to live a Christ-centered, faith-filled life marked by integrity. His son was to be his successor. I noted eight "Be" statements in the saintly king's loving words to his son. Here they are, and note how timeless they are, not only as loving to the young, but also to those of any age, living in the year 2017:

- "Be merciful (and especially to all who are experiencing violence);
- Be patient, with everyone;
- Be humble (in this life, that God may raise you up in the next);

Note: Doesn't his reflect Jesus' teaching?!

- Be truly moderate;
- Be gentle;
- Be honorable;
- Be chaste." *

I firmly believe that the first "Be," be merciful, was of special importance to St. Stephen as an overall Christ-like attitude toward our neighbor. To walk in his/her shoes, to reach out, to try to understand, to help in whatever way. St. Stephen could write these words to us today, couldn't he? Our Catholic tradition from the past can inform and enrich our lives of faith today...and no doubt, tomorrow.

OUT OF DARKNESS

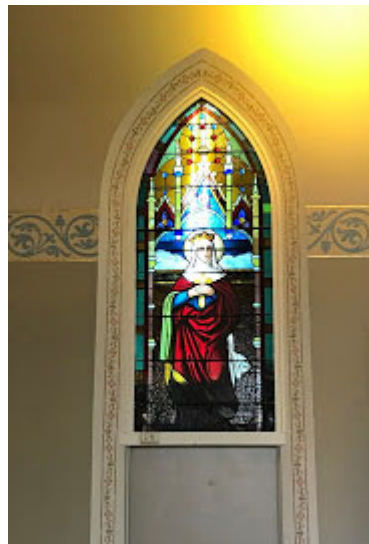
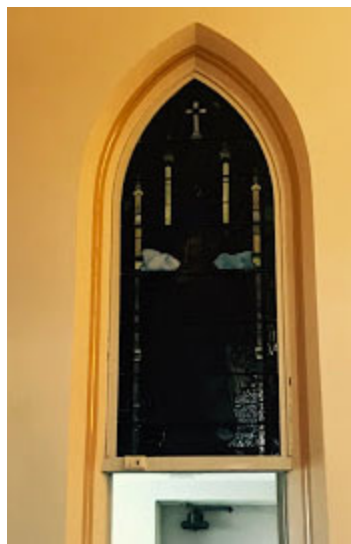
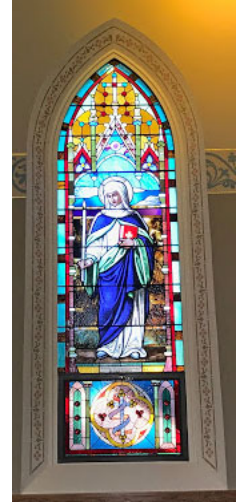
Of course one of the main architectural features of our beautiful church building are the original stained glass windows. The male saints are on the west side and the female saints are on the east side. If you have been inside at different times of the day you have seen that the sun can really highlight the colors and textures of the glass, creating stunning portraits of the saints.

During the 1950's there was hope that a school could be built and that dream became a reality in 1952. The decision was made to construct it on the east side of the property and join the buildings together with a convent.

The connection of buildings blocked the sunlight from two of the original windows and one of them was modified to be positioned above the door. Over the years there has been an attempt to backlight the windows with fluorescent tubes. The light didn't look natural and it was complicated to change the bulbs when they burned out. And of course, someone had to remember to turn on (and off!) the switches.

Our Project 2017 lighting designer worked on finding a natural looking solution that would mimic sunlight. Our electrician installed LED rope lighting behind the windows and came up with the idea of putting them on timers so that the light comes on in the morning and turns off at dusk.

This window is of St. Catherine of Sienna, the patroness of Italy. She was canonized in 1461 and was named a Doctor of the Church in 1970. She is holding a feather pen and a book--these indicate her writings and the fact that she is a Doctor of the Church. The dagger through her heart symbolizes her great love for Christ.



St. Helena graces the window over the door to the breezeway. Born in Bithynia, Asia Minor (present-day Turkey), circa 248, St. Helena was married to Roman Emperor Constantius and had a son who would become Constantine I, also known as Constantine the Great, the first Roman emperor to become a Christian. St. Helena, who converted as well, oversaw the construction of churches on Holy Land sites. She would later be credited with discovering the cross upon which Jesus Christ is believed to have been crucified. St. Helena died circa 328 in Nicomedia (present-day Turkey). She was known for her kindness to the poor.

Each window tells a story. Would you be interested in learning more about the saints and symbols of our church? We will soon be offering church tours and literature. If you would like to volunteer to be a docent or help to work on a brochure, please contact Martha at stewardship@sfdslg.org.
