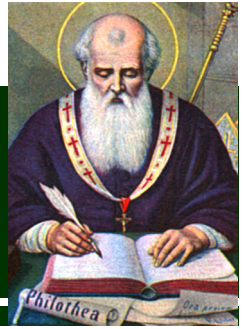

Dear Parishioners

As Hurricane Harvey's rainfall and flooding continue to devastate the lives of millions in Texas, people naturally want to help in some way. Usually the quickest way to respond is through an online donation or through sending a check to a disaster relief organization. We all know, however, that some unscrupulous people will take the opportunity to scam people out of their money by setting up scam relief funds. So how can we know whether an organization is legitimate, and how can we determine how much of our donation will actually go to helping victims of Harvey?

A website called Charity Navigator (charitynavigator.org) enables us to get background information and ratings to help us find charities that we can trust and support. At this point, Charity Navigator has a list of charities who are responding to the needs of the people affected by Harvey, along with ratings and information to help us make an informed decision before we give. One of the listed agencies is Catholic Charities of the Archdioceses of Galveston-Houston. The website gives this organization a 90.54 rating out of 100. Of the total donations this organization receives, 91.8% goes to the services it delivers. Donations can be made online and be designated for disaster relief by going to catholiccharities.org. 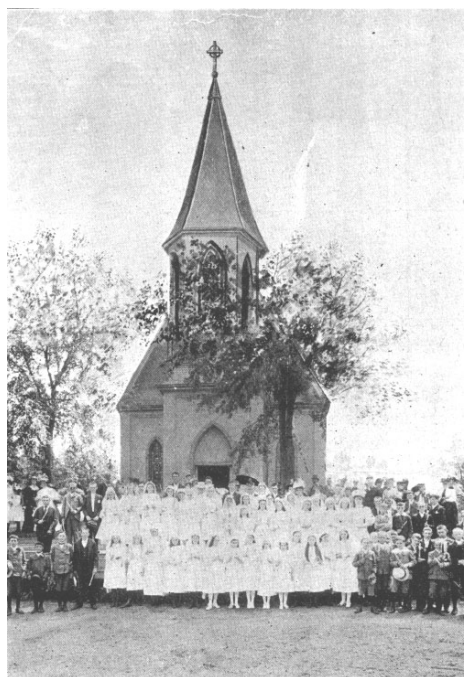

PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 2016-17 FISCAL YEAR

Preface

We are presenting the Annual Financial report for our fiscal year, July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. This has been a particularly unusual year for our parish because several factors have weighed into our finances during this year. With the Generous Hearts campaign last fall, we asked parishioners to consider increasing their regular annual contribution to the normal expense of simply running our parish. We also had the Project 2017 campaign which asked you to make a onetime special contribution to the unique project of repairing and restoring our worship space.

This school year will usher in our participation in the School Choice program which will bring State support to subsidize tuition expenses for students who want a Catholic education but could not otherwise afford one. This past year, as always, none of these things could be accomplished without the continuing support of you, our fellow parishioners, who continue to live the call to stewardship by giving of your time, talent and treasure.

Results

The Generous Hearts campaign resulted in a \$20,000 increase, in envelope and offertory giving over the prior year for the period of January 1 through June 30, 2017 and this represents an 11% change. Couple that with a \$45,000 donation from the Home & School Association, a bequest of \$29,631 from a parishioner's estate plan and our new Reverse Raffle profit of \$8,000 enabled St Francis de Sales to cover all operating expenses and leave a 1% surplus. Historically, bequests, as mentioned above, have been an integral part of our ability to maintain parish ministries.

Even with the increased activities, our overall school and parish expenses were maintained within 1% of our budget presented to the archdiocese prior to July 1, 2016. The results are presented graphically in a pie chart format. The results reflect a net positive revenue of \$9,805 versus an \$89,142 deficit for the 2015-16 prior year. While these results are favorable they are based on onetime events unlikely to repeat.

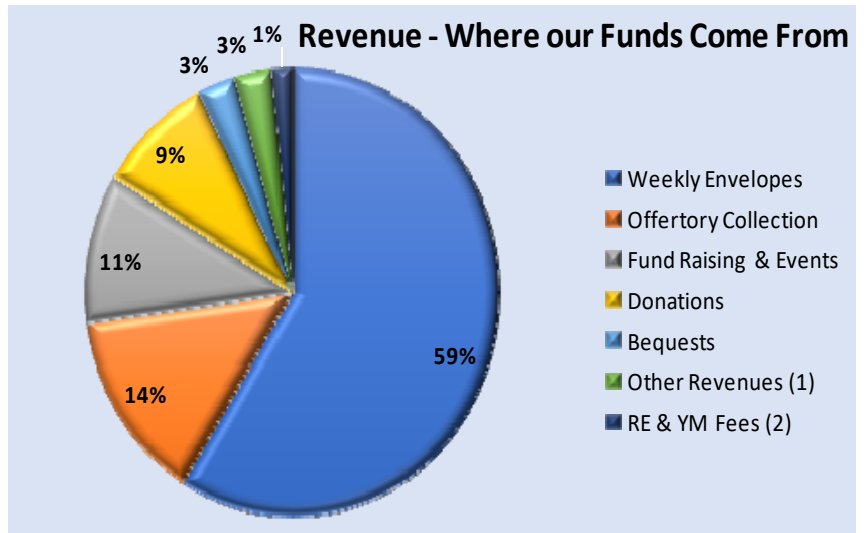
Parish administration decided to apply to the State of Wisconsin School Choice program for St Francis de Sales. A successful application affords us an opportunity to reach out to lower income families and offer a Catholic education in our parish school to those who might not otherwise be able to afford it. This application process has been completed through volunteer and staff efforts and this fall we have ten choice students enrolled. The financial implication for our parish is a projected net additional tuition support for our 2017-18 school year in excess of \$60,000 after associated expenses.

These results do not include Project 2017 finances whose pledges exceeded over \$2.0 million. Our parish had capital project reserves from our Faith in our Future campaign concluded in 2010. These funds covered the early expenditures of Project 2017 and parishioners meeting their pledges enabled our parish to continue paying the improvements without borrowing money. After the pledge period of three years is completed, the projected cash balance of over \$300,000 can be used for future capital expenditures.

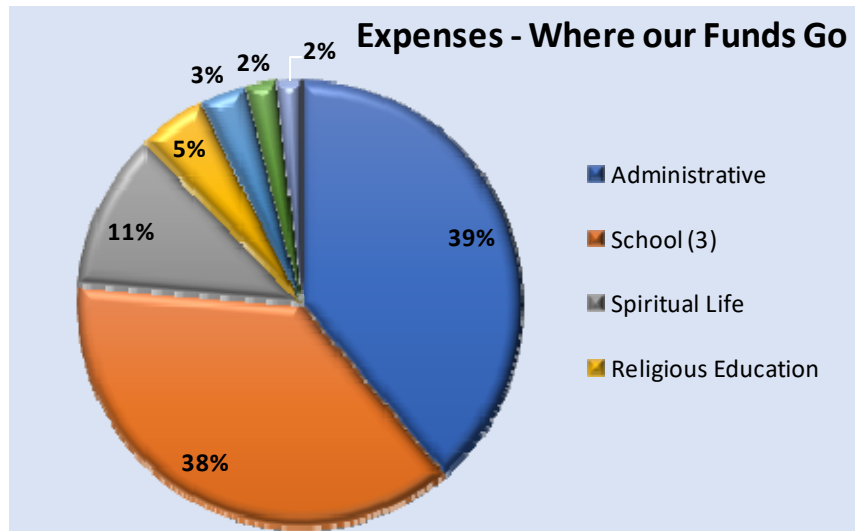

SOWING THE SEEDS OF FAITH

It's hard to picture now but our "old" Stations of the Cross were square panels of tone on tone wood. We sent them over to Conrad Schmitt Studios last December to be painted and gilded (and later put in frames). Before they left our building they were photographed and canvas prints were made. We used those photo panels on the walls of the parish center while we held Mass there during the renovation. They were beautifully done and many of you remarked that you could hardly tell that they were reproductions. Remember this?



It was the intention to donate this group of Stations of the Cross to a church or organization that could use them. Fr. Beda, who has come to speak at SFDS for the past few years about his missionary work in Tanzania, was contacted. He is in the process of building a new church and catechesis center in the village of Ngujni. Named St. John the Baptist, it has recently opened but is still getting some finishing touches (see photos below). When asked if they needed Stations of the Cross for their new church, Fr. Beda enthusiastically said "YES!". But how to get them there??

Parishioner Amy Amann stepped up and offered to work with her company, SPX FLOW in Delavan, to pack and ship these items (as well as some holy water fonts) to Fr. Beda's new church. They have very generously donated the shipping costs to Africa. Their employees helped to get them boxed and ready for shipping. Our package traveled through Germany and then Dubai, and arrived at Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, on Tuesday, September 5! Thank you to Amy, SPX FLOW, and all who made this possible. The church will officially open for Masses on Nov. 3 and Molly Druffner promises to send photos of the installed Stations!

TOURNAMENT PROCEDURE

Ideally, teams turn in completed sign-up form to the parish office by Friday, Sept. 15 along with the \$25 entry fee per 2-person team. Must have at least one adult of 18 yrs. or older per team. Or bring with you on 9/17.
