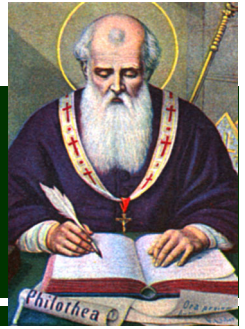

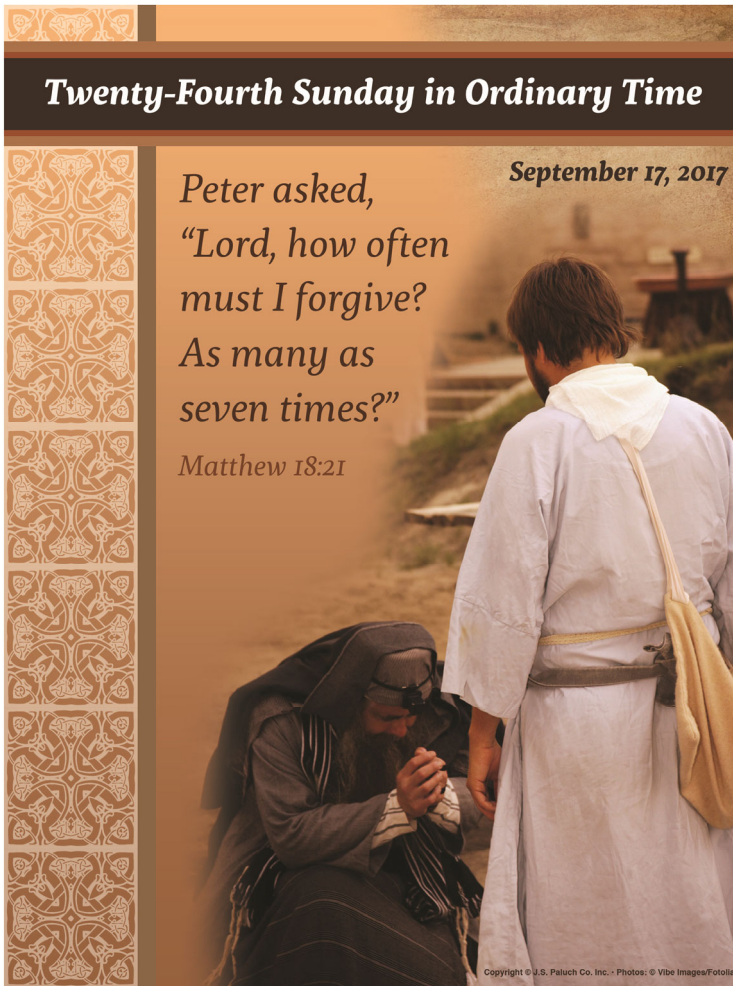

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

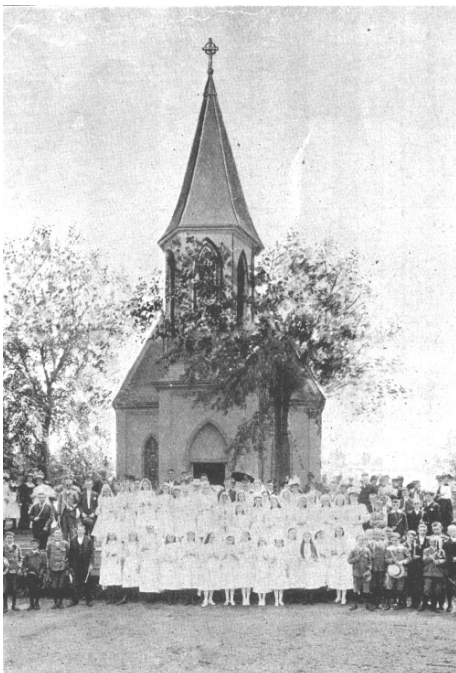
Have you thought about getting more involved at St. Francis de Sales? The Stewardship

SFDS HAS A HEARING LOOP

Do you wear hearing aids? Be sure to ask your audiologist if your hearing aids can be programmed for a "T-Coil". As part of the Project 2017 Renovation, we have installed "hearing loops" in the floors of both the chapel and the church.

What does this mean? You should be able to push a button or move a switch on your hearing aid (your audiologist will need to program but most times it's already built in) so that the sound will be picked up directly by your hearing aid to give you better clarity.

If your hearing aids are not compatible, ask one of the ushers to borrow one of our hand held loop receivers with headphones during Mass. This will take advantage of the same technology. If you have used this system before, it will be easy for you! If you have hearing aids but don't know about the t-coil, **ask your audiologist** if you can take advantage of this technology. You probably have seen this sign at theaters and auditoriums...It's the international sign to let people know that there is a hearing loop in the building. This logo is now at all of our church entrances and in our church bulletin to let visitors know that they can tune in!



CHURCH ETIQUETTE

Here are some good reminders for our friendly parish:

- 1) If church is full, please move in to your pew to accommodate others who might need a seat. If you need to stay on the end, step out and let people in!
- 2) Be mindful of those who have come to pray before or after Mass. Try to keep talking and commotion to a minimum.
- 3) Gum. Please don't leave it around!
- 4) If you see old bulletins, programs, or trash in your pew, please take it out with you and throw it away.
- 5) Be friendly to families with small children. It takes a lot of effort for them to get to church!
- 6) If an usher finds a seat for you, go there! Standing crowds can cause a lot of congestion by the church entrances.
- 7) Help visitors find their way around
