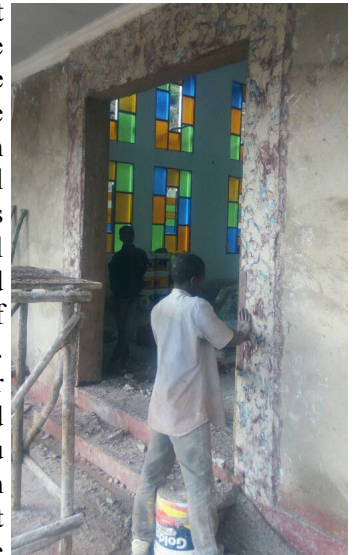
Kathleen has a masters in Social Work from Dominican University and works as a Hospice Social Worker. She and her husband, Jim, live in Lake Geneva. She was introduced to many of the people she works with at SFDS while attending 7:00 a.m. daily Mass.

Kathleen loves all that she does here, but probably the thing that she is the most proud of is that (for the past 2 years) she has planned and organized **Divine Mercy Sunday** at our Parish. Celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter (also known as Octave Sunday), Divine Mercy Sunday is a day that celebrates the merciful love of God shining through the whole Easter Triduum and the Easter mystery. It is a day of declaration of reparation for all sin, thus the Day of Atonement. With a special bi-lingual liturgy that includes liturgical dancers and the Divine Mercy Choir, it has been a wonderful collaboration of all people in our parish community. "I pray the Divine Mercy chaplet almost every day. It has gotten me through some difficult times in my life. When our parish was chosen to have a Holy Door, I knew that we needed to have a Divine Mercy Sunday here. I felt a tugging at my heart to lead the way even though it was way out of my comfort zone."

Kathleen is very enthusiastic about St. Francis de Sales Parish, and sees herself as a "Salesian"...a member of the Society of St. Francis de Sales founded by St. John Bosco in Turin, Italy in the 19th century and devoted chiefly to education, the youth, and the poor. "I feel very at home at this parish. I wish we could go beyond our doors to bring people in to see all of the wonderful things that go on here".
