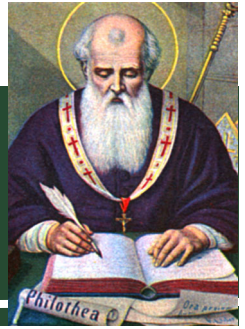

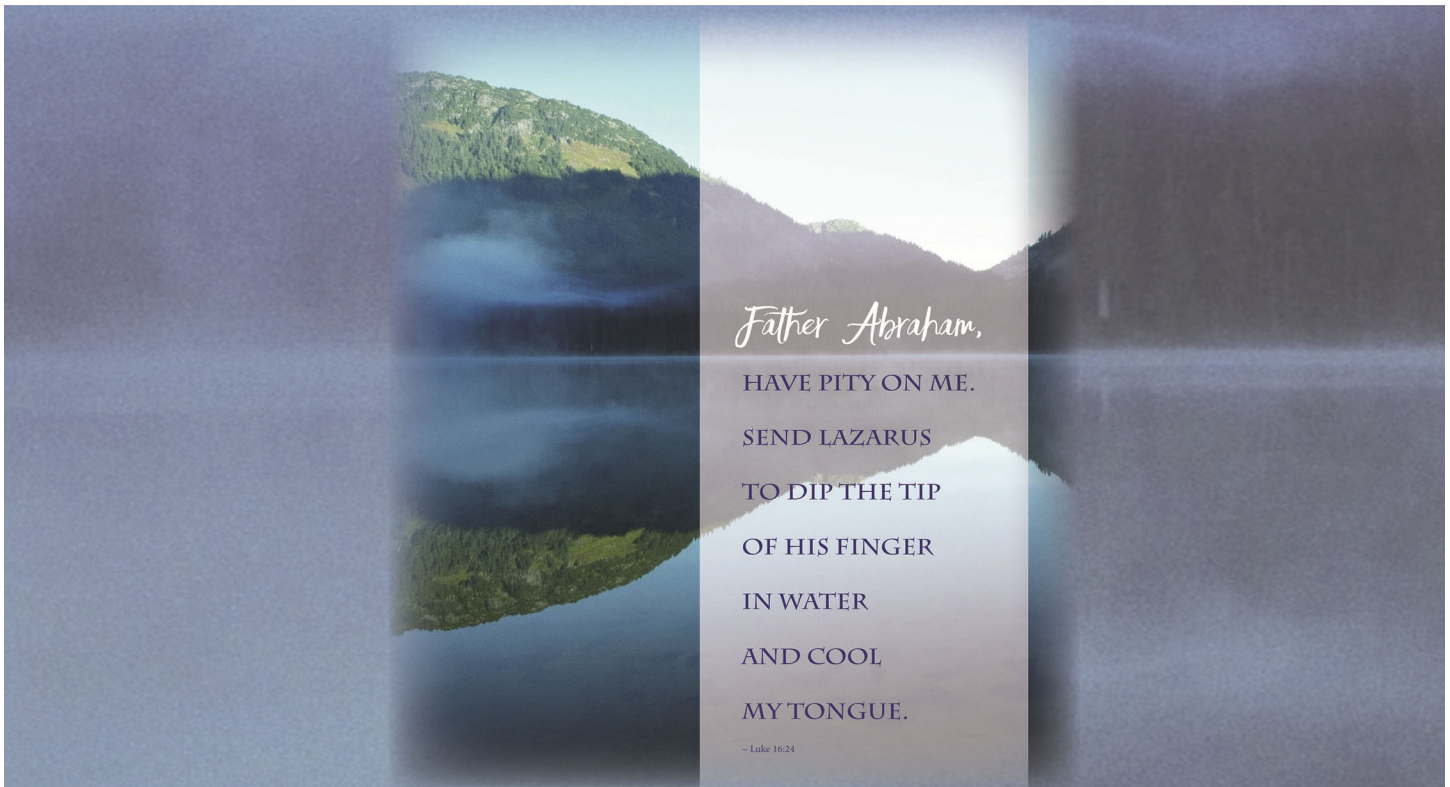

Parish Financial Report for 2018-19 Fiscal Year

Preface

We are presenting the Annual Financial report for our fiscal year ending June 30, 2019.

This school year continued and expanded our participation in the School Choice program which brings State support to subsidize tuition expenses for students who want a Catholic education but could not otherwise afford one. This past year, as always, none of these things could be accomplished without the continuing support of you, our fellow parishioners, who continue to live the call to stewardship by giving of your time, talent and treasure.

Results

Presented by Daryl Braun-Finance Chairperson and Treasurer Trustee Fran Zappitelli.

Our parish completed our July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 fiscal year with an Income of \$7,856 in excess of expenses. Favorable income factors include \$28,034 in bequests and a family trust donation of \$35,812 which was split equally between the parish and school as part of the donation directive. Our participation in the Wisconsin School Choice program resulted in a \$138,300 tuition payment from state funds for children of qualifying families. This is an increase of \$74,827 over the prior year. These additional funds reduce our parish subsidy for operating our school by that same amount. Total operating expenses were \$11,159 under budget and \$26,473 under the prior year.

Envelope and Offertory giving was \$25,207 under budget and \$5,306 over the prior year.

The Table 1 illustrates our parish cash, stocks and money market funds and the respective organization within our parish to whom these are designated or restricted.

Table 2 summarizes the donations to and tuition awards from our Angel Fund.

The tables and charts on the following pages illustrate more detail on the source of our monies and the associated expenses and the school income and expense.

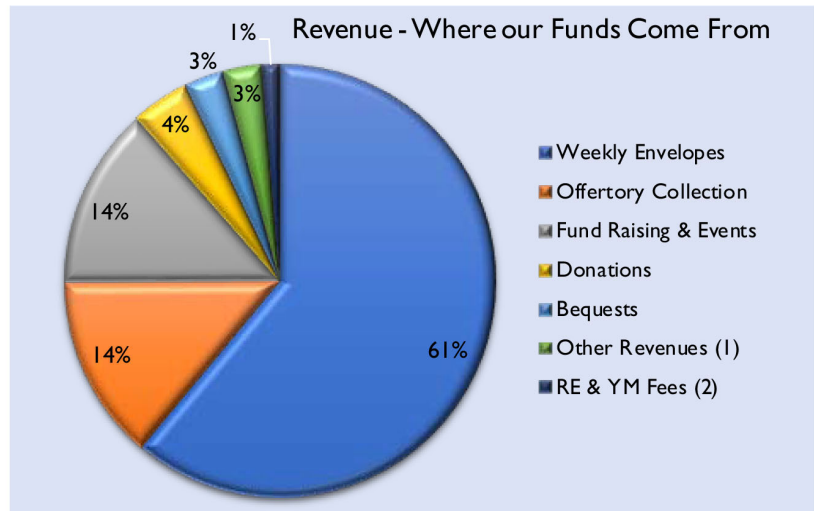

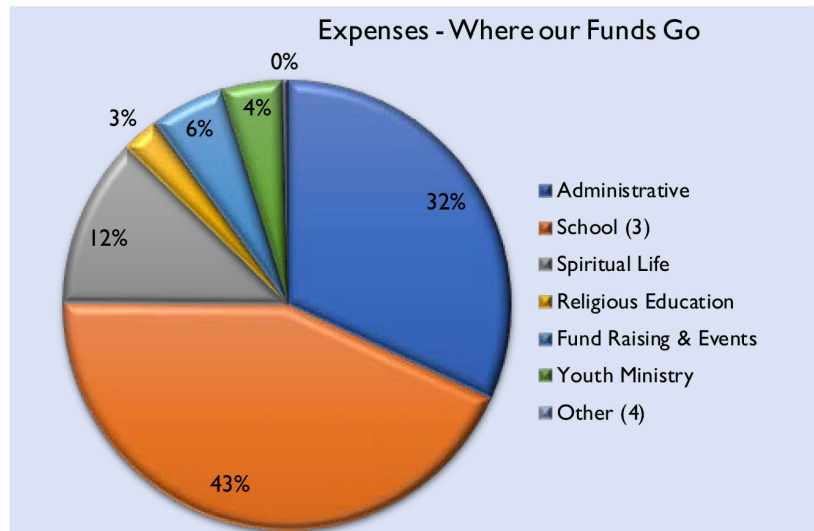

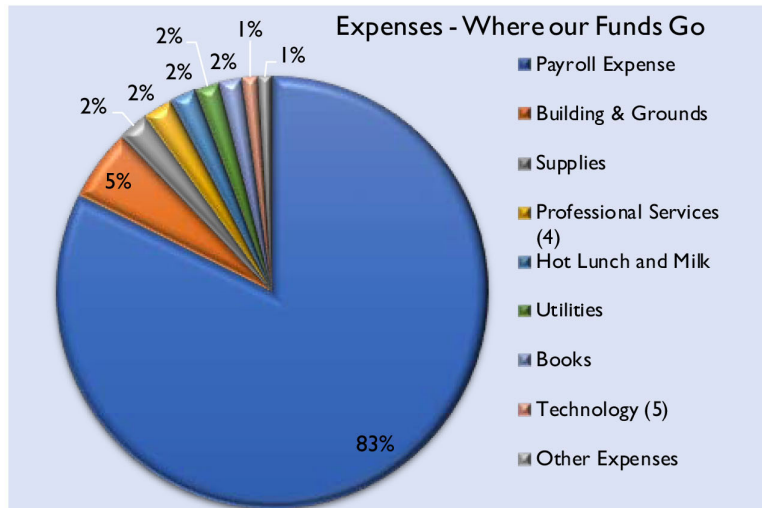

2. Donations include gifts from the Knights of Columbus, Home and School Association, \$17,852.72 from a Family Trust and several other donations.
3. Other revenues include government monies for student meals.
4. The major expense is the audit fee for school choice compliance along with website maintenance, background checks and school student attendance and performance software.
5. Majority of these funds purchased laptop computers for teachers, a projector, and computer supplies and accessories.

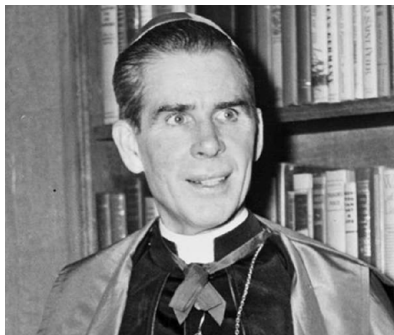

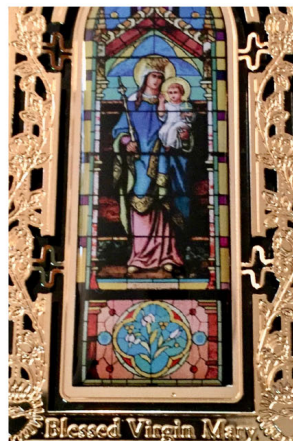
