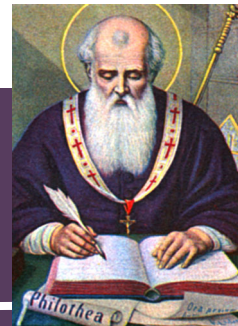

## WHY WE SAY THE ST. MICHAEL PRAYER.

Pope Leo XIII, realizing by divine enlightenment the present and future struggles of the church against the powers of hell, felt convinced that through the intervention of St. Michael, hell would be conquered and the church restored to peace and liberty. Amen.

Daily this powerful petition rises heavenward throughout the world and we may believe that in answer to this plea the great Archangel hastens to the aid of the Bride of Christ, the Church.

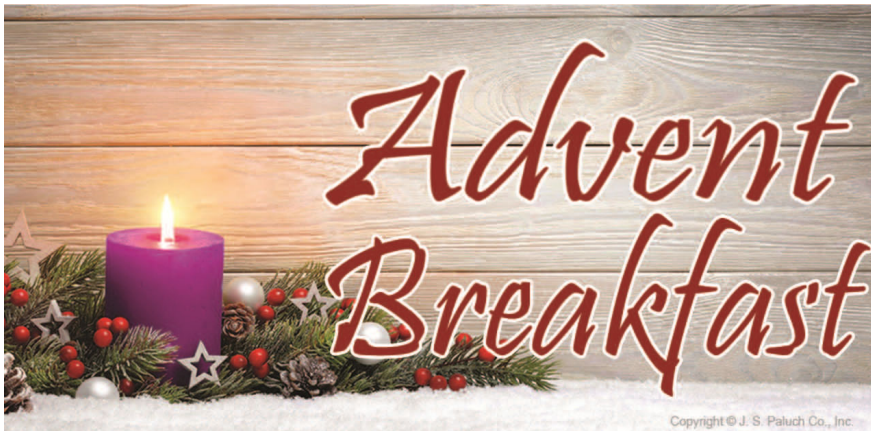

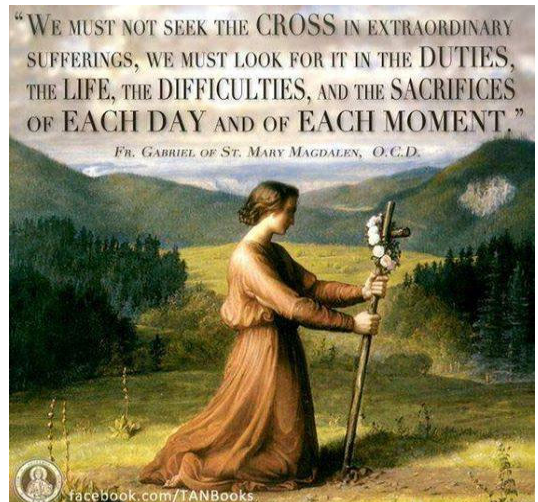
