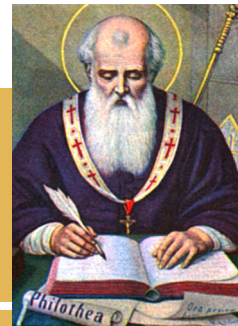


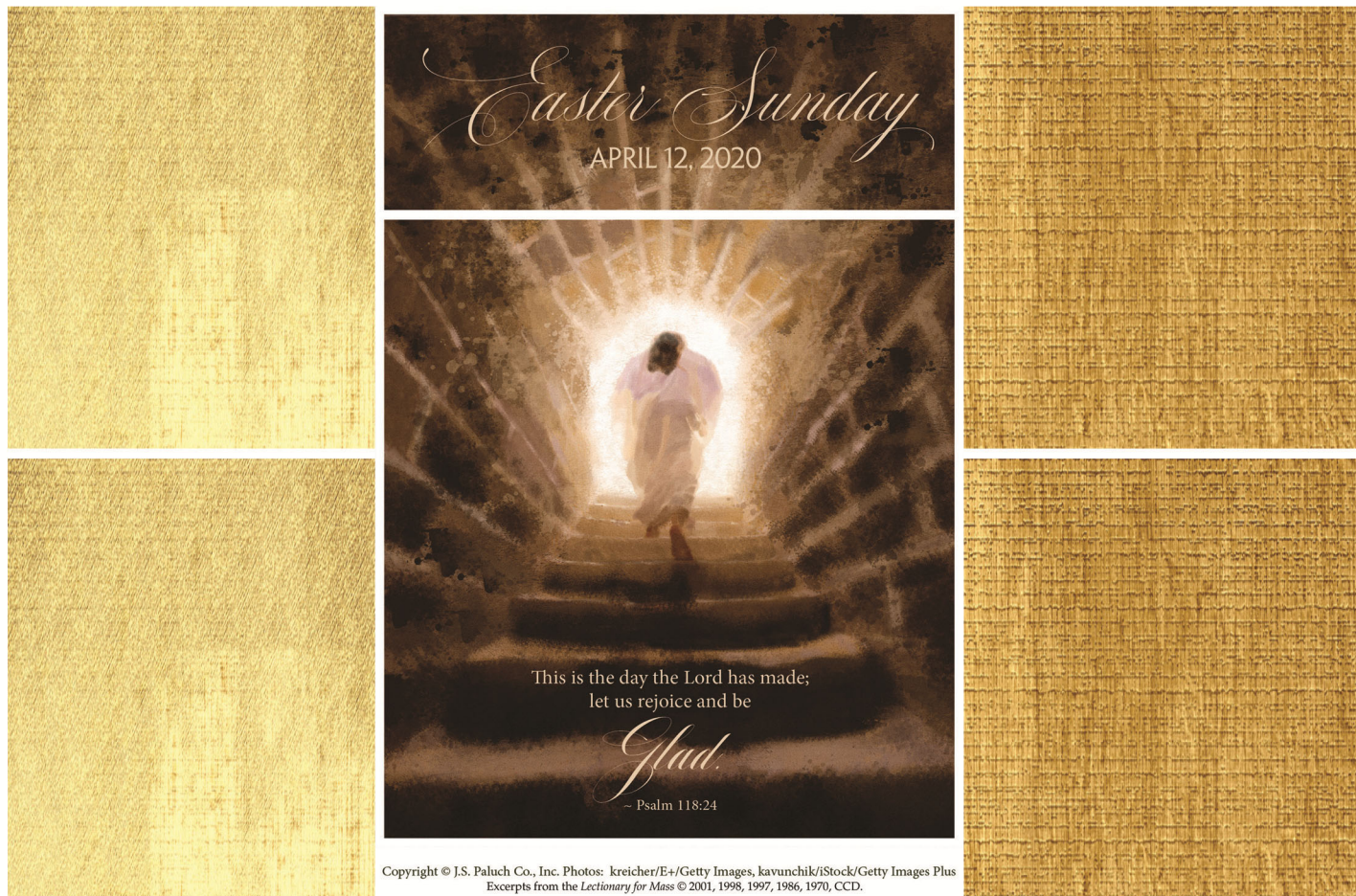

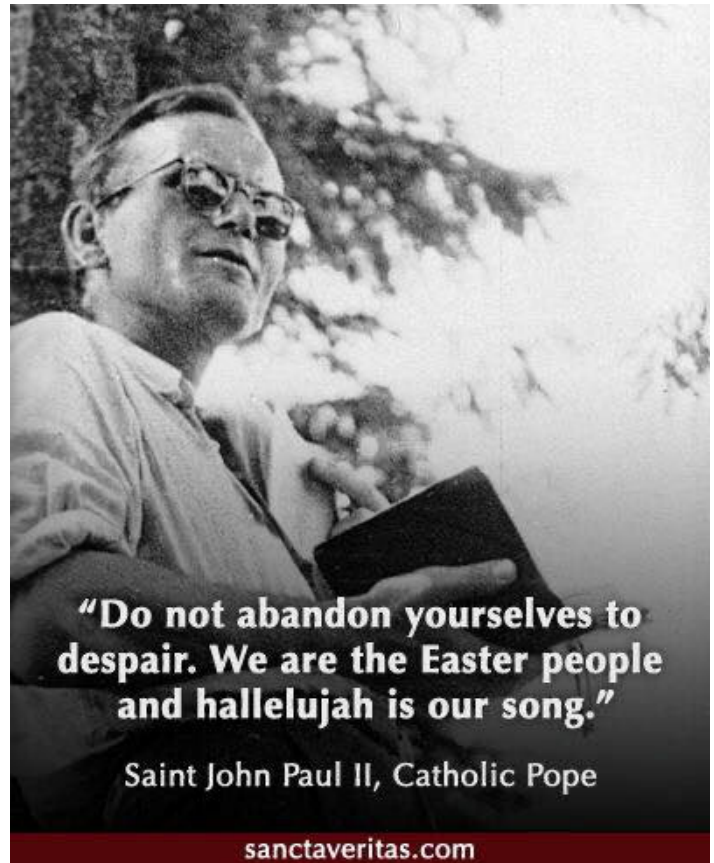

LETTER FROM FR. MARK

Dear Parishioners,

Watching a commercial on television a few days ago, I noticed a sign that a family had attached to the fence in their front yard. The message on the sign said: **“Hope is not cancelled”**. What a perfect message for us as we celebrate Easter Sunday 2020. The world is starving for hope right now and the Resurrection story is the greatest source of hope we have.

The picture of the first Easter morning was bleak. The disciples had believed that Jesus was their hope and the hope of Israel. They thought He was the one who was going to save and deliver them from Roman rule and oppression. Three days earlier their hopes were dashed. All hope was gone, or was it? Jesus appeared to them.

The women on their way to the garden to anoint the body of Jesus walked in silence and despair, Jesus, the one they had looked to, had been crucified. All hope was gone, or was it?

The stone was rolled away and the tomb empty.

Mary wept as she approached the gardener and asked where they had taken the body of her teacher and friend. All hope was gone, or was it? She was called by name: “Mary”.

Sometimes when we are in the middle of a crisis, the best thing to do is the hardest – to step back and take a look at the bigger picture. This pandemic is bringing out the best and worst in human nature; sacrifice and care, hoarding and selfishness. Real hope is more than the wish that this would soon be over and that we could carry on with life as normal. Even though we cannot “go” to church, we “are” the church. This is an opportunity to reflect hope in how we live and respond to the threat we are facing, and to find renewed hope and joy in the Risen Lord. Alleluia.

My prayers are for you and your family; may you experience a blessed Easter. May God keep you safe during this time.

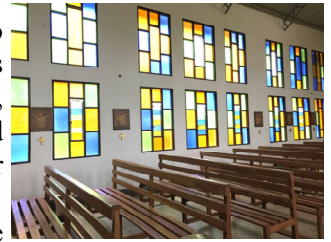

UPDATE FROM THE BWAMBA MISSION

Dear Parishioners,

With great excitement, we would like to announce that we have become a Sister Parish to St. John the Baptist, Bwamba Mission of Tanzania, East Africa. St. Francis De Sales has supported the Bwamba Mission, led by Fr. Dr. Beda for the past 5 years with prayers, monetary donations and physical gifts. In fact, the temporary Stations of the Cross we used during the Project 2017 renovation were donated to St. John the Baptist to be used in their Church.



As we put Project 2017 in the rearview mirror, we are still overwhelmed by the generosity of our Parishioners in giving of their time, talent and treasures. The result was simply stunning. We were blessed to be able to accomplish this renovation and give our church a much needed make over.

As we transition to this new endeavor, Jesus in Matthew 25:34-36,40 implores us to do more:

34Then the King will say to those on His right hand, 'Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world: 35for I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in; 36I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me.' 40And the King will answer and say to them, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.'



By entering into this Twinning relationship with St. John the Baptist in East Africa, we can in fact, change someone's life or more importantly, save someone's life and follow the command of Jesus laid out by Matthew. Through this special relationship, we will be able to use our time, talents and treasures to change the lives of fellow Christians that do not have the resources to help themselves. We will continue to support St. John the Baptist with a mission appeal, but will also have other opportunities to help: eg. with school supply drives, clothing drives, mission trips, etc.

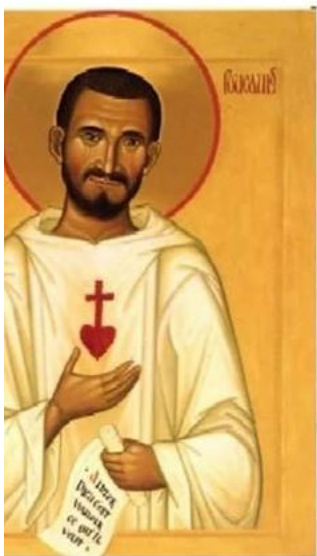
Here is a brief overview of the Bwamba Mission and St. John the Baptist: Bwambo Village sits atop of the South Pare Mountains (two hours south of MT. Kilimanjaro) and is home to Bwambo Mission, which was started by Dutch Catholics in the early 1960s. The mission consists of a small health center, St. Luke's, an elementary school, St. John the Baptist, and two parishes, St. John the Baptist and Immaculate Conception. Fr. Beda Kiure, MD, who visited our parish in years past, is now in a fellowship for OB/Gyn surgical training, and has left his close friend Fr. Josaphat Mkilindi, MD in charge of the parishes and hospital for the next 2 1/2 years. The Pare Tribe is made up of mostly farmers and skilled laborers. The mountains are granite and provide a good resource for the Pare people to harvest and sell granite rocks for building and construction materials. Bwambo Village is made up of about 25,000 villagers, but the Health Center has a catchment area of over 250,000.



St. John the Baptist Parish, our new Sister Parish, is located in a smaller village near Bwambo called Ngujini. This village is located in a dry and windy spot, which makes it difficult for the villagers to plant crops. Although the parishioners at St. John the Baptist are a joy-filled people, they lack basic necessities such as water, food, education, and access to healthcare because of lack of income. We look forward to getting to know them and offering both material and spiritual support.

Dr. Mark and Molly Druffner and their children have been serving both villages and hospital for the past eleven years. Molly has spoken to our parish about the work they have done there and the many ways in which we, at St. Francis de Sales, have helped to develop both Churches, the school, and the health center. They, along with Fr. Dr. Beda, are very grateful for the many contributions we have made so far and are excited to share their experiences, service trips, and project updates with us. "We thank God ahead of time for this new relationship of mutual faith, prayers, and compassion for the people of St. John the Baptist Parish. Thank you all!"

EASTER 2020 LETTER FROM ARCHBISHOP LISTECKI

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

How profoundly we have all experienced the desert of Lent, fasting from our everyday routines, praying for the recovery of our world, and giving in new ways to our loved ones and communities during this time of pandemic. How closely you have journeyed alongside Jesus on his way to Calvary, sacrificing your desires, preferences, schedules, energy, or even health, to respond to the call to love one another in service and charity. And, how keenly you have felt the agony of Good Friday and Holy Saturday, in which Mary and the Disciples mourned the loss of Jesus' physical presence and experienced intense longing for His return.

On the morning of the Resurrection, some women went to Jesus' tomb to mourn a dead man. As I think about the state of our world right now, and the dramatic effects it has had on all of our lives, it appears that we, too, journey with the women to the tomb to mourn. With our churches standing empty this Easter, it appears that we have been defeated. But, my friends, hear the words spoken to the women by the angel who greeted them at the tomb, "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay."

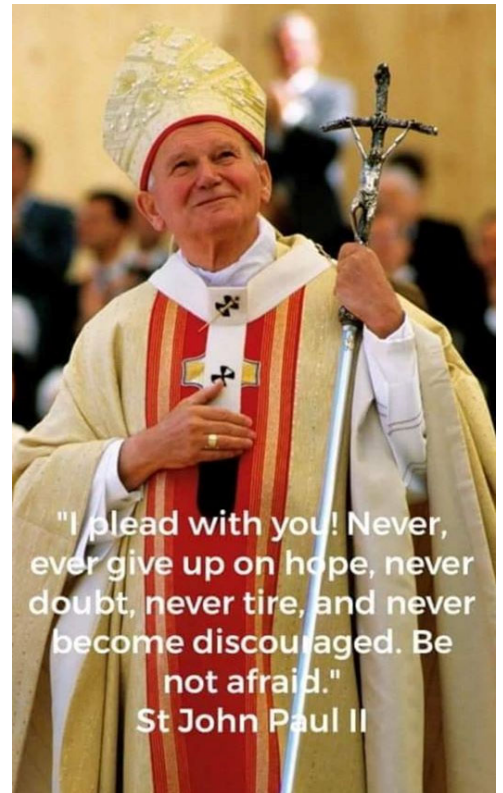
The sign of the empty tomb is not a sign of destruction and failure. No; rather, it is the sign par excellence of our faith. St. Paul tells us that without the Resurrection, our faith is in vain – it would be meaningless. (1 Cor 15:14) The empty tomb is the physical reminder of the Resurrection and the evidence that our faith is not in vain. The empty tomb confirms that Jesus is God, that he has indeed risen from the dead, and that sin and death are conquered.

While our churches are certainly not tombs, I ask you to consider how they are tremendous signs of faith in a world filled with fear. Our empty churches should remind us of the power of our faith, which is the power of the mercy and love of God. We may be physically distant from one another – and, how I long to see you at Mass – but we are not alone. Our God has come to save us. Jesus has truly risen and alive! He lives within us, for we are members of His Body, and he has not abandoned us.

After seeing the empty tomb, the angel instructed the women to go tell the disciples that Jesus had risen from the dead. I invite you this Easter to consider how you will share that message of faith, hope and love with those in your lives who may need this message of hope. How will someone know that you have seen the empty tomb and that this joy may also be theirs? How will your interactions with others or decisions that you make reflect a heart that is full of gratitude and dedicated to service? How will your actions of self-sacrifice and self-denial be a witness to our community of your respect for life? How will you forgive others because you have experienced forgiveness and new life in the sacraments? How will your longings for heaven attract others to seek the kingdom of God before all else?

Let this Easter be a time of renewal for your faith. See the sign of the empty tomb and rejoice in Christ's victory over our sin and death. Resolve to return to him with your whole heart, trusting that he will provide for your every need. Live in the joy of the Resurrection and share that joy with those who have yet to experience it. I pray continually for all of you, that through this time of physical separation, your faith may be strengthened beyond measure and that your hearts may be opened to receive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.
