INTRODUCTION OF FR. RAY GUTHRIE

I am glad to be assigned to St. Francis de Sales in Lake Geneva. I have been a part of the Lake Geneva Community for almost twenty-one years as a part-time resident. I grew up in Chicago and attended St. Ignatius College Prep, where under the guidance of the Jesuits, came to love Chemistry and Religion, an interesting mix. I attended the University of Illinois, University of Chicago, St. Meinrad Seminary and the University of Notre Dame, with degrees from Chemistry to Scripture. I have served in seventeen parishes, ten high schools and two colleges. This has led to serving in Seven Archdiocese and Diocese. In five of the assignments, I was involved in the largest parishes, one being over 7,000 families. Thank God, I have never been kicked out! But again, there is always a first (Smile).

I have been teaching in grade school, high school and college, along with coaching high school varsity and junior varsity basketball and football for forty-one years. Many times, I did not take the role of the pastor so I could teach and coach. Just this past year I coached varsity football at Marquette U High. However, in this case I was the Pastor of Holy Family and St. Robert, each being a little over a thousand families. What a joy!

My deep love of education influences the way I serve in my many parishes. After teaching in college for the past few years in Chicago, as well as leading parish groups studying the Church Fathers, Scriptures, Church History and Liturgy, I felt it was time to settle down. In many places I have been, I was assigned numerous times to fix situations or guide the community in the direction they wanted to go. Respectfully I am now coming to a parish that I call home and especially with considerable family in the area. I am here to serve the people of St. Francis de Sales. I see myself as St. Paul states in his letter to the Romans, as one who is still struggling to become what God calls me to be. Hence with all this background mentioned, I want to conclude my introduction and my role of ministry in the parish with a story from my graduate studies.

It was the second day of class at Notre Dame and I was proud that I was one of fifteen accepted in this scripture program. Sitting in class Prof. Blenkinsopp asked us a question on Amos one of the minor Prophets. One of the sisters who was a provincial of her order in Austria answered the question quite powerfully. Prof. Blenkinsopp looked at Sister and asked her what she did before joining this class. Her response revealed she was directing over 5,000 people in her order. I was impressed to be in her presence. Then our professor said and I will never forget it, "Sister I don't know how you lead, but we are not in this class to share ignorance." There were more words he shared, but in that moment Professor Blenkinsopp taught me that no matter how much I know, there is so much more I don't. Consequently, coming to St. Francis I hope to learn much about life from all of you as we serve our Lord Jesus by serving one another.

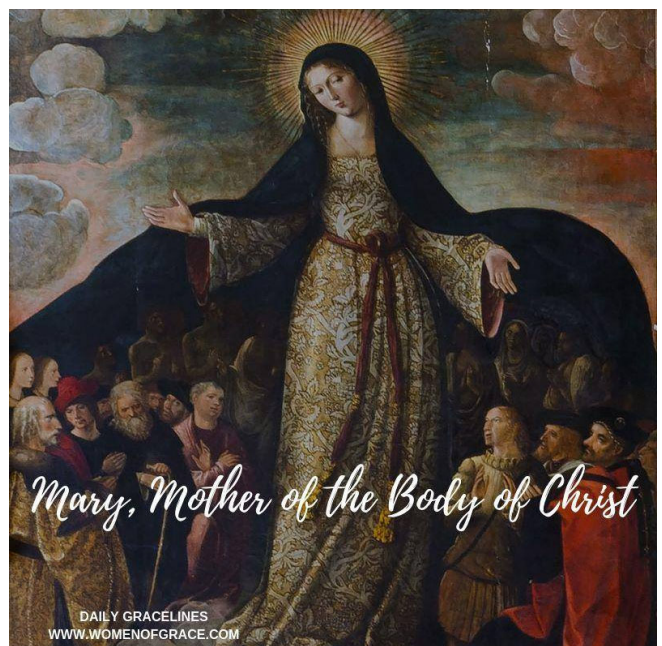

LETTER TO THE HISPANIC COMMUNITY

Dear Hispanic Community,

I want to introduce myself. I am Fr. Ray Guthrie, the new Administrator/Pastor of St. Francis de Sales in Lake Geneva. Unfortunately, I am not a Spanish Speaking priest, but have a dear love for the Mexican culture. I attended St. Ignatius College Prep High School run by the Jesuits in Chicago, and my close group of six friends was an interesting mix of backgrounds. Two were strict Italians from Taylor Street area, two were part of the 18th Street Mexican Community, one Lithuanian and myself, German/Irish! I have served in communities of diverse backgrounds, teaching Morals and Ethics in college at USF in Joliet, IL, where many of my students were young Hispanics entering nursing and other aspects of the medical field.

I have had the privilege of traveling in such countries as Mexico, Colombia, Costa Rica, Peru and Guatemala. I am blessed to have had two weddings at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City, but again cannot speak Spanish. Because I was the administrator of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Silvis IL, a parish community that was 35% solely Mexican (but English speaking), I was able to celebrate many rituals of the Hispanic culture, such as Quinceañeras, La Posada, the Lasso and Coin ceremony of weddings, the Day of the Dead, however always in English. I was also involved with Fr. John Foley and Fr. Chuck Neihaus who began the first "Christo Rey" School Program in Chicago.

I mention all of these issues to show how important the Hispanic culture has been to me in my life as a high school student and as a priest. Therefore, even though I cannot speak Spanish and being almost 67 years old I wish I could get it, I will be very present and active with all the various groups at St. Francis de Sales. Knowing I cannot speak Spanish, I have asked the Schoenstatt Fathers Community, a community from Chile and living in Whitewater, to guide the Spanish Masses at St Francis de Sales, as they serve the broader Schoenstatt Movement in the world. This US American community belongs to the Chilean Province and therefore all of the groups in Whitewater speak Spanish. Fr. Jeff Roedel, who will be working more closely with our community, just finished ten years of formation, the majority of that in Santiago, Chile. The Archdiocese of Milwaukee originally asked their community to serve St. Patrick Parish in Whitewater because of their ability to speak Spanish. They are looking forward to working with our Spanish Speaking Community.

However, as I stated before just because Fr. Jeff will work with the Hispanic Community because of His ability to speak Spanish, does not mean that I will not be part of all the groups of our parish. I may not be able to speak Spanish, but all the members of St. Francis de Sales are my parishioners, and I will attend to the needs of all, whether I can speak the language or not. A smile, a nod, a hug, just being there is a universal sign of care. My blessings and prayers to all.

QUERIDA COMUNIDAD HISPANA,

Quiero presentarme. Yo soy el padre Ray Guthrie, el nuevo Administrador / Pastor de San Francisco de Sales en el Lake Geneva. Desafortunadamente, no soy un sacerdote que habla español, pero tengo un gran amor por la cultura mexicana. Asistí a la escuela preparatoria St. Ignatius College Prep dirigida por los Jesuitas en Chicago, y mi grupo cercano de seis amigos fue una mezcla de interesante experiencias. ¡Dos eran italianos estrictos del área de Taylor Street, dos eran parte de la Comunidad Mexicana de la Calle 18, uno lituano y yo, alemán / irlandés! He servido en comunidades de diversos orígenes, enseñando Moral y Ética en la universidad de la USF en Joliet, IL, donde muchos de mis estudiantes eran jóvenes hispanos que ingresaron en enfermería y otros aspectos de medicina.

He tenido el privilegio de viajar a países como México, Colombia, Costa Rica, Perú y Guatemala. Tengo la suerte de haber tenido dos bodas en la Catedral de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe en la Ciudad de México, pero nuevamente no puedo hablar español. Así fue administrador de la parroquia de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe en Silvis, IL, una comunidad parroquial que era 35% exclusivamente mexicana (pero de habla inglés), pude celebrar muchos rituales de la cultura hispana, como Quinceañeras, Posadas, la ceremonia de lazo y monedas en las bodas, el Día de los Muertos, aunque siempre en inglés. También estuve involucrado con el Padre. John Foley y el padre Chuck Neihaus, quien comenzó el primer programa escolar "Cristo Rey" en Chicago.

Menciono todos estos temas para mostrar que importante ha sido para mí la cultura hispana en mi vida como estudiante de secundaria y como sacerdote. Por lo tanto, aunque no puedo hablar español y con casi 67 años, desearía poder entenderlo, estaré muy presente y activo con todos los diversos grupos en St. Francis de Sales. Sabiendo que no puedo hablar español, le he pedido a la Comunidad de Padres de Schoenstatt, una comunidad de Chile que vive en Whitewater, que guíe las Misas en español en San Francisco de Sales, ya que sirven al Movimiento de Schoenstatt más grande del mundo. Esta comunidad estadounidense pertenece a la provincia chilena y, por lo tanto, todos los grupos en Whitewater hablan español. El padre Jeff Roedel, quien trabajará más cercanamente con nuestra comunidad hispana, el acaba de terminar diez años de formación, la mayoría de ellos en Santiago, Chile. La Arquidiócesis de Milwaukee originalmente pidió a su comunidad que sirviera a la Parroquia de San Patricio en Whitewater debido a su habilidad para hablar español. Están ansiosos por trabajar con nuestra comunidad de habla hispana.

Sin embargo, como dije antes no solo porque el padre Jeff trabaje con la comunidad hispana debido a su habilidad de hablar español, eso no significa que no seré parte de todos los grupos de nuestra parroquia. Aunque yo no pueda hablar español, pero todos los miembros de St. Francis de Sales son mis feligreses y atenderé las necesidades de todos, ya sea que pueda hablar el idioma o no. Una sonrisa, un saludo, un abrazo, solo estar allí es un signo universal de cuidado. Mis bendiciones y oraciones a todos.

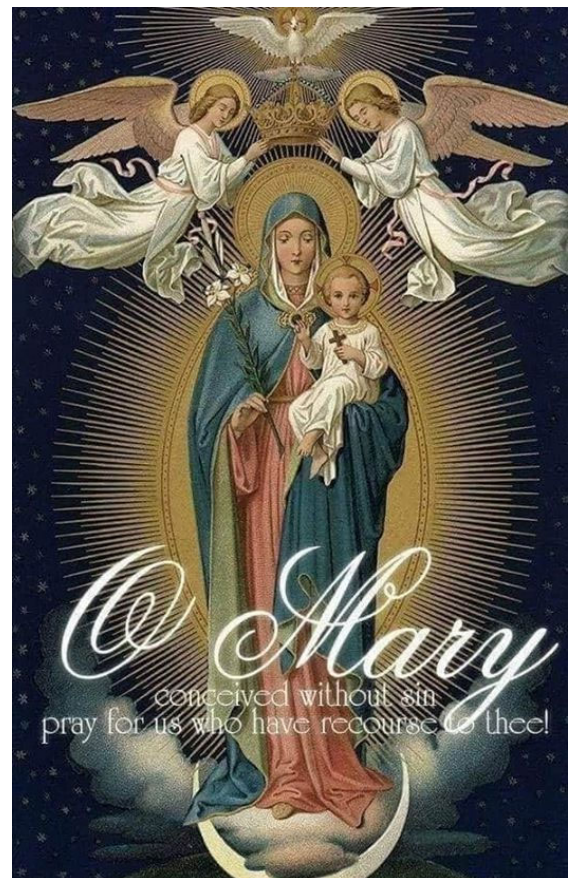
