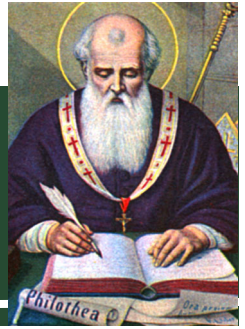

OCTOBER: THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

On Oct. 7, the Catholic Church celebrated a memorial liturgy in honor of Mary as *Our Lady of the Rosary*. October has also been traditionally known as the month of the Rosary. The recitation of the Rosary is a devotion based on Sacred Scripture. In 1974, Pope Paul VI wrote about the Rosary: The Rosary draws from the Gospel the presentation of the mysteries and its main formulas. As it moves from the angel's joyful greeting and the Virgin's pious assent, the Rosary takes its inspiration from the Gospel to suggest the attitude with which the faithful should recite it.

In the harmonious succession of *Hail Marys*, the Rosary puts before us once more a fundamental mystery of the Gospel--the incarnation of the Word, contemplated at the decisive moment of the Annunciation of Mary. The Rosary is thus a Gospel prayer, as pastors and scholars like to define it, more today perhaps than in the past. (*Marialis Cultus* 44)

Consequently it would be wonderful to become familiar with the Rosary as a wonderful way to reflect on the Blessed Mother's Son, Jesus the Christ. For as all loving mothers proclaim the greatness of their children, so does our Blessed Mother in presenting her Son through this beautiful devotion. Holy Mary Mother of God, pray for us now and at the hour of our death. Amen

RESPECT LIFE MONTH

Many times two issues seem to get mixed together that I always question how they have been mixed together. The issue is abortion and Women's Rights. I understand all Men and Women have Rights as created by our God. What those rights are has been debated since the beginning of time and I believe will be debated until all Creation is one in God in the words of St. Paul. But how the birth of child and women's rights have been put together is very confusing.



Yes, we have rights!! And I believe Human Rights are essential as St. Thomas Aquinas states in His Summa of many volumes. We Call that those Rights as presented in the Book of Genesis, Free Will. Free Will is a fundamental teaching of Roman Catholicism. It is the belief that we have the free will to do right or wrong, the freedom to choose between the good and evil. As Catholics we believe Evil has no say over us other than the ability to tempt us through offering images of evil that look so desirable that we chose to do the evil verses the good that sometimes takes self-sacrifice.

So when I see women's rights and abortion put on the same plane teaching morals, I always say to my students that conception of a child is the end result of our free choice or free will. You had the freedom to love another, you had the freedom to choose to act out that love through conjugal love. You made the choice at that point, your rights as a woman or man begin there in the action of physical love (I know there are other cases where a choice is not made, but I am talking about the many cases of free choice to conjugal love).

With the conception of a child rights disappear. They always would ask how is that? Well you have the right to choose who you want to marry. Once you get married the rights to be involved with another person in intimate love are eliminated, or your freedom is limited by your first choice. So also with your first choice of sexual relations leading to the conception of a child. Something we forget is that when we choose True Human Rights and to enter into a True Loving relationships will also put limits on later choices based on our first choice.

Once Jesus freely choose to do the Will of the Father, he would die, once we choose to have a child that means we need to care for, feed, and cloth our children no matter the cost. Once we choose to have a sexual relationship with another leading to conception of a child how can we say we have the freedom now to do whatever we want. What would that then say about true friendships, true Love and any important relationship in our life, all which when chosen limit future choices. THE CATHOLIC COMEBACK - PHASE 2

Dear brothers and sisters,

The weekend of the 19th and 20th of September marked an unprecedented time for us as Catholics in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Archbishop Jerome Listecki updated some of the guidelines on our Catholic Comeback Matrix, making effective on Sept. 14 that we moved to phase 2; and he indicated that the dispensation from the obligation of Catholics to attend Sunday Mass, which he had provided since last March, was no longer to be extended beyond the weekend of Sept. 12 & 13.

The Church joyfully proclaims in the Second Vatican Council that “the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian Life” (LG 11) Contrary to popular beliefs of the contemporary world, it is very unlikely that one, who is Catholic, can maintain, and live the Catholic faith and yet not attend Sunday Mass or receive the Eucharist and the other Sacraments. Now every person who calls themselves Catholic has the responsibility to prayerfully evaluate their return to Mass. While it is certainly my hope that more and more of our parishioners will return to Mass, it does not mean that all should immediately return. This is the guidance from our Archbishop:

“If a person is at risk because of age, underlying medical conditions or a compromised immune system, one would be excused from the obligation. If a person is caring for a sick person, even if they are not sick, they would be excused from the obligation out of charity. Fear of getting sick, in and of itself, does not excuse someone from the obligation. However, if the fear is generated because of at-risk factors, such as pre-existing conditions, age or compromised immune systems, then the fear would be sufficient to excuse from the obligation.”

As we return safely to Mass again, let me share with you some of the ways we are going to keep everyone safe:

- If you have any flu like symptoms, please stay home.
- Face masks are required and please use hand sanitizer, at least, as you come in and before receiving Holy Communion.
- Please sit only in the mark pews and please fill the front pews first.
- If you are a family of 4 or more please sit in a pew that is empty, leaving the other pews for individuals to sit 6 feet apart as the share a pew with a person who is not from the same household.
- During the Sign of Peace, please wave or do a simple head vow to other parishioners who do not live with you in the same household. You can shake hands or do another physical gesture only with people who live with you in the same house.
- For Communion, please stay in your pew. The priest or the Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC) will come to you. If you are receiving Communion, please feel free to stand or kneel. Please receive reverently the Body of Christ only in your hands and consume Him right away. If you are not receiving Holy Communion, please sit and crossed your arms over your chest as the priest or EMHC walk by.
- If you want to bring Holy communion to a family member at home, please bring a pyx and present it open at the time you receive the Body of Christ.
- Confessions will be offer on Saturdays from 4:00 pm until 4:45pm and also after weekday 7:30am Masses right after Mass
- After a couple of weekends, we will reevaluate if we need to add another Mass depending on numbers of parishioners returning.

Please, be patient and cooperative with our requests, directions, and expectations. All are intended for your well-being and safety. All of us have different opinions and experiences with this pandemic, so please let us be respectful of the different levels of comfort that each will demonstrate during this time.

For my brothers and sisters who would not be coming to Mass in our parish, we will continue to record the Mass and making it available for the weekend, if the technology cooperates.

And as people of faith, let us continue to keep each other in prayer and ask the intercession of Saint Michael the Archangel for the end to this pandemic: St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls.
