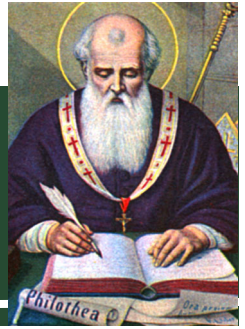

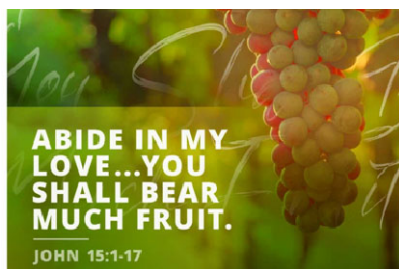

WEEK OF CHRISTIAN UNITY 2021



The theme for our Week of Christian Unity 2021 which begins this Monday January 18th was chosen by the Monastic Community of Grandchamp located

near Lake Neuchatel in Switzerland. The community, founded in the 1930s where a group of Reformed women, searching for a place to pray in solitude in imitation of Jesus Christ, repeatedly gathered and drew a growing group of guests that necessitated a permanent presence. The community continues to welcome guests and retreatants for periods of retreat, silence, healing or in search of meaning. The theme, "Abide in my love... You shall bear much fruit" from the Gospel of John, chapter 15, expresses the Grandchamp Community's vocation to prayer, reconciliation and unity in the Church and the human family. Here, Jesus reminds his disciples that he is the vine and we are the branches. If we abide in him, in Jesus and the Covenant made in his precious blood, we will be such a healthy branch as to bear much fruit, abundant grapes. Jesus manifests this in his references to loving one another: "Abide in my love." This love of Christ figuratively speaking is akin to the healthy sap that nourishes the vine throughout all its branches. Jesus the man is lovingly begotten into human society by the love God has for all human beings, through the cooperation of a human woman, the Virgin Mary. In return, humanity is repeatedly raised from sin to justification by the love of Christ, the only Son of God, one with the Father and the Spirit through all the ages. This resource for abiding in his love is endless.

The image of branches helps believers understand that they are all diverse as individuals, but brought together in the one Vine, who is Christ alive in the Church. It can also point out, in these times of growing ecumenical witness, that the differing expressions of Christian faith are also branches which cannot live on their own and still authentically proclaim the Gospel to all creatures. We preach Christ crucified and risen to a needy world, that the world may have hope. Separately, that "sap" which keeps all the branches healthy, gets stuck in blocked veins of animosity, distrust, bigotry and ignorance. Only open veins will allow the sap to flow. Only then can all the branches bear much fruit. Therefore, abiding in Christ's love, let us love one another.

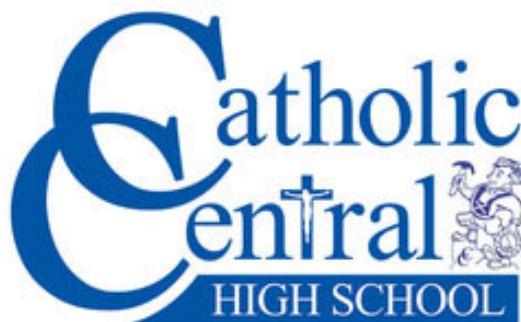

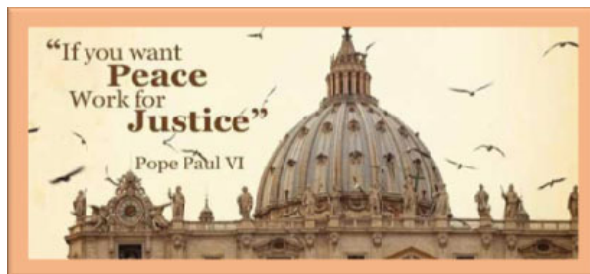

CATHOLIC EDUCATION IN SOCIAL JUSTICE

As we remember Martin Luther King Jr. Who even though all people may not agree with in all he said as with any man or woman. As a follower of Jesus Christ and a reader of the Scriptures often in the areas of Social Justice he quoted the Prophets and the Gospels. It might be good to look at what does our Catholic Church teach in these areas that Martin Luther King Jr. challenged in American Society. So here are the seven themes of Catholic Education in Social Justice

The U.S. Catholic Bishops identifies 7 themes that lie at the heart of Catholic Social tradition:

1. **Life and Dignity of the Human Person** -- "The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society."
2. **Call to Family, Community, and Participation** -- "The person is not only sacred but also social. How we organize our society in economics and politics, in law and policy directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community."
3. **Rights and Responsibilities** -- "The Catholic tradition teaches that human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities met."
4. **Option for the Poor and Vulnerable** -- "A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring."
5. **The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers** -- "The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation."
6. **Solidarity** -- "We are one human family whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. We are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, whatever they may be."
7. **Care for God's Creation** -- "We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan."



CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

Ten years ago Archbishop Dolan at the time wrote about Catholic Schools in America Magazine. He began by saying that our youth and their faith formation is not just something of the home but also in the school life of our children and that these combined realities are essential building blocks to the future of the Roman Catholic Church. But there are major issues that have become obstacles for most families and parishes today. He stated a few then went on to say, “The most crippling reason, however, may rest in an enormous shift in the thinking of many American Catholics, namely, that the responsibility for Catholic schools belongs only to the parents of the students who attend them, not to the entire church.

Nowadays, Catholics often see a Catholic education as a consumer product, reserved to those who can afford it. The result is predictable: Catholics as a whole in the United States have for some time disowned their school system, excusing themselves as individuals, parishes or dioceses from any further involvement with a Catholic school simply because their own children are not enrolled there, or their parish does not have its own school. The truth is that the entire parish, the whole diocese and the universal church benefit from Catholic schools in ways that keep communities strong. So all Catholics have a duty to support them. Reawakening a sense of common ownership of Catholic schools may be the biggest challenge the church faces in any revitalization effort ahead.

Thus, we Catholics need to ask ourselves a risky question: Who needs Catholic schools, anyway? The answer: We all do. Much of the research on Catholic education conducted over the last five decades—from the Rev. Andrew Greeley to the University of Notre Dame; from the National Opinion Research Center to the work of independent, often non-Catholic scholars—has answered with a unanimous voice that without a doubt Catholic schools are an unquestioned success in every way: spiritually, academically and communally.

More to the point, the graduates they produce emerge as lifelong practitioners of their faith. These Catholic graduates have been, are and will be our leaders in church and society.” So as we celebrate Catholic schools during this month please realize the importance and the mission of our Catholic Schools such as St. Francis de Sales Catholic schools as we build and move our faith community into the future.
