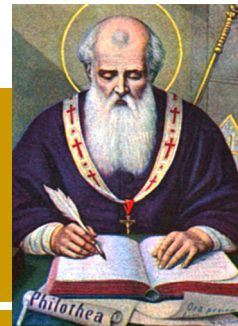


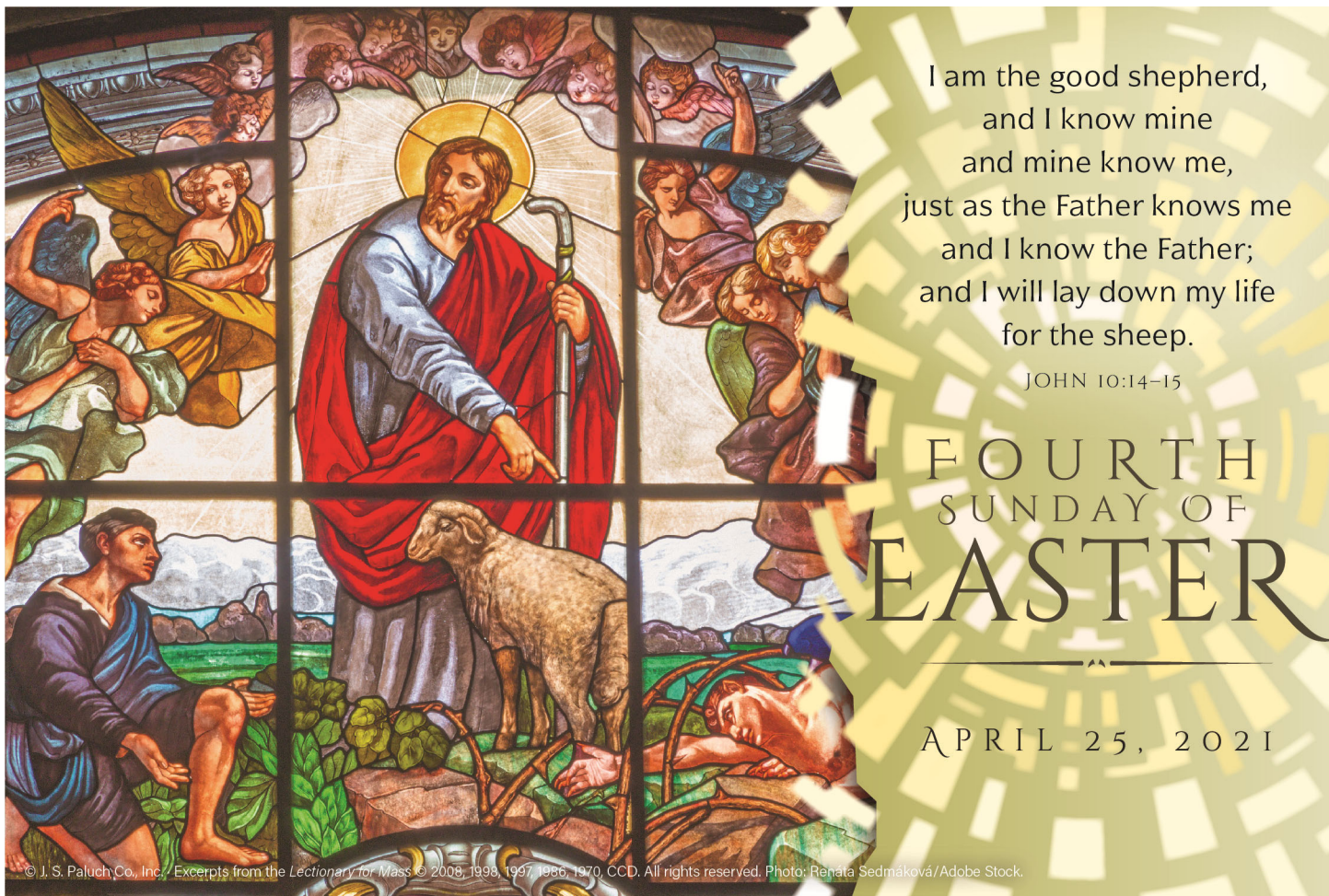

CONFIRMATION

On May 12 our own Bishop Jim will be present to offer the Sacrament of Confirmation to our High School Candidates who have been preparing for their final step of Baptism with the confirming upon them of the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit. The word for the Sacrament of Confirmation comes from the centuries of when the Bishop was the only person allowed to Baptize. Yet, as the communities grew that “faculty “of Baptism was then granted to the local Priest, and later completed by the Bishop when he “Confirmed the Baptism” of the local Priest. That is why to this day in the normal course of the Sacraments only the Bishop or special delegate of the Bishop can “Confirm.”

RCIA for adults allows the local Priest to “Confirm” only at the Easter Vigil.” But even then before every Easter Vigil the parish Priest has to write for permission to do so with the Specific names. Keep all of our Confirmands in your prayers. St. Joseph the Worker pray for them.

On May 1, we celebrate the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Pope Pius XII established this feast day in 1955 to honor St. Joseph and celebrate the Catholic Church’s commitment to the dignity of labor. St. Joseph cared for Mary, his wife, and Jesus, his son, through his work as a carpenter, representing for us the ideal of dignified work and faithful contribution to the common good. His example reminds all workers to participate in God’s continuing creation each and every day through our own labor.



As I reflect on St. Joseph the Worker, I am reminded of the situation we find ourselves in coming off of some devastating realities of work. Many companies that are in the service areas like Restaurants and Resorts in our area have had to lay off a number of workers. Other areas like the Hospitals, Nursing Homes, Health Care and Grocery Stores had to be very protective of their workers so that basic needs such as food and medicine could still be shared in our communities. This has challenged us to look more closely at the power and importance of work. We see this in the “heroes work here” signs around the community.

A group that has really had to adapt with great struggle this year and yet one of the most essential in our communities is our teachers. We know that lack of social interaction for our children has shocking psychological results. In pivotal moves, teachers are leaving their classrooms because of the great stress of teaching in a style they were never educated nor fortified with such as the technologies which have proliferated this year. In our Community our Catholic and Public School educators have truly been Saints in imitation of St. Joseph who as a worker did what his Family needed whether swiftly rushing with a pregnant wife from Nazareth to Bethlehem, or even more hurriedly from Bethlehem to Egypt because of Family needs.

As we celebrate St Joseph the Worker this coming weekend, we recall all workers who have experienced injustice and sought better working conditions for themselves and those around them. Their contribution to the common good cannot be understated. All workers deserve dignity, fair compensation, and safe work environments that allow them to shape our shared future and contribute to the common good.

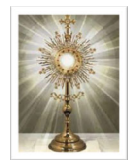

BOLETÍN INFORMATIVO DEL PADRE RAY

Era primo de San Bernabé y acompañó a San Pablo en el primer viaje misionero que hicieron estos dos apóstoles. Pero al llegar a regiones donde había muchos guerrilleros y atracadores, donde según palabras de San Pablo: "había peligro de ladrones, peligro de asaltos en los caminos, peligro de asaltos en la soledad" (2 Cor.), Marcos se atemorizó y se apartó de los dos misioneros y se volvió otra vez a su patria.

En el segundo viaje Bernabé quiso llevar consigo otra vez a su primo Marcos, pero San Pablo se opuso, diciendo que no ofrecía garantías de perseverancia para resistir los peligros y las dificultades del viaje. Esto hizo que los dos apóstoles se separaran y se fueran cada uno por su lado a misionar. Después volverá a ser otra vez muy amigo de San Pablo.

San Marcos llegó a ser el secretario y hombre de confianza de San Pedro. Como le escuchaba siempre sus sermones que no eran sino el recordar los hechos y las palabras de Jesús, Marcos fue aprendiéndolos muy bien. Y dicen que a pedido de los cristianos de Roma escribió lo que acerca de Jesucristo había oído predicar al apóstol. Esto es lo que se llama "Evangelio según San Marcos".

El evangelio de San Marcos es como una repetición de lo que el Apóstol Pedro predicaba. Es el más corto de los 4 evangelios. El de San Lucas tiene 1,140 frases. El de Mateo 1,068. El de San Juan 879 y el de San Marcos solamente tiene 746 frases. Son 16 capítulos llenos de narraciones muy vivas, gráficas, salpicadas de detalles interesantes. Se propone no dejar de narrar lo que contribuya a hacer más llamativa la narración. Allí parece estar hablando un testigo ocular que se ha fijado en todo y lo repite con agrado. Es el reflejo de lo que San Pedro presencié y que se le ha quedado grabado en su memoria. Se fija más en los hechos de Jesús que en sus discursos. Sus narraciones son agradables por lo frescas y espontáneas. Parece un reportero gráfico narrando lo que sus ojos vieron y sus oídos escucharon. Presenta atractivos cuadros: gestos, miradas, sentimientos de Jesús. Dicen los especialistas que el evangelio de San Marcos mientras más se le estudia, más se convence uno de que el que lo escribió era un verdadero artista de la narración y que con este escrito contribuyó a que muchos millones de lectores se entusiasmen por la persona de nuestro amable Salvador. Un sabio afirmó que "el evangelio de San Marcos es el libro más importante que se ha escrito", pues parece que fue el primer evangelio que se escribió y que de él sacaron mucho material los otros tres evangelistas.

San Marcos tiene 105 paisajes y de ellos aparecen 93 en Mateo y 85 en Lucas. De las 746 frases de Marcos, San Mateo reproduce 606 y copia el 51% de las palabras que emplea Marcos. San Lucas reproduce en su evangelio 320 de las 746 frases de San Marcos. Solamente hay 24 frases de San Marcos que no se encuentran ni en Mateo ni en Lucas. Por eso es que el Evangelio de San Marcos es un libro verdaderamente importante.

San Pedro llama a Marcos en sus cartas: "Hijo mío". Y San Pablo cuando escribe a Timoteo desde su prisión en Roma le dice: "Tráigame a Marcos, porque necesito de su colaboración". Dicen los antiguos historiadores que fue un compañero muy apreciado por los dos apóstoles. Dicen que San Marcos fue nombrado obispo de Alejandría en Egipto, y que allá en esa ciudad fue martirizado por los enemigos de la religión un 25 de abril.

La ciudad de Venecia (Italia) lo eligió como patrono y construyó en su honor la bellísima Catedral de San Marcos.

WHY ARE WE CELEBRATING THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH?

In the words of Pope Francis: “Now, one hundred and fifty years after his proclamation as *Patron of the Catholic Church* by Blessed Pius IX, I would like to share some personal reflections on this extraordinary figure, so close to our own human experience. For, as Jesus says, “out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks” (Mt 12:34).



My desire to do so increased during these months of pandemic, when we experienced, amid the crisis, how “our lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked. People who do not appear in newspaper and magazine headlines, or on the latest television show, yet in these very days are surely shaping the decisive events of our history. Doctors, nurses, storekeepers and supermarket workers, cleaning personnel, caregivers, transport workers, men and women working to provide essential services and public safety, volunteers, priests, men and women religious, and so very many others. They understood that no one is saved alone...

How many people daily exercise patience and offer hope, taking care to spread not panic, but shared responsibility. How many fathers, mothers, grandparents and teachers are showing our children, in small everyday ways, how to accept and deal with a crisis by adjusting their routines, looking ahead and encouraging the practice of prayer. How many are praying, making sacrifices and interceding for the good of all”.

Each of us can discover in Joseph – the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence – an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and of gratitude is due to them all.” Then Pope Francis list attributes of St. Joseph to model in our lives:

1. *A beloved father*
2. *A tender and loving father*
3. *An obedient father*
4. *An accepting father*
5. *A creatively courageous father*
6. *A working father*
7. *A father in the shadows*

Part Three of the Church Fathers:

After the last gathering of the Church Fathers I promised the community that I would do a third program on the Church Fathers. We had completed the first three hundred years and only the major issues of the great Church Fathers at the time such as St. Justin Martyr, St. Irenaeus, St. Cyril, and St. Ignatius of Antioch. Many loved learning what the earliest of the Church Fathers had to refine, understanding issues which today we take for granted but had not yet been decided. This third part is going to deal with how we deal with Scripture as Catholics, how we deal with the Trinity which interestingly not all Christians believe, and foundational statements of the Creed which are more complex than we recite on Sundays.
