




## OUR DEDICATION TO ST. JOSEPH AND THE WORK OF GOD'S PEOPLE

To foster deep devotion to Saint Joseph among Catholics, and in response to the "May Day" celebrations for workers sponsored by Communists, Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker in 1955. This feast extends the long relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers in both Catholic faith and devotion.



Beginning in the Book of Genesis, the dignity of human work has long been celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in Genesis to care for the earth (Gn 2:15) and to be productive in their labors. Saint Joseph, the carpenter and earthly father of Jesus, is but one example of the holiness of human labor. Jesus, too, worked as an artisan with Joseph. He learned the trade from Saint Joseph and spent his early adult years working side-by-side in Joseph's shop before leaving to pursue his ministry as preacher and healer.

Starting with Pope Leo XIII when writing Rerum Novarum in 1890's to our present Popes, which is the Church considers it her task always to call attention to the dignity and rights of those who work, to condemn situations in which that dignity and those rights are violated, and to help to guide changes so as to ensure authentic progress by man and society."

Saint Joseph is held up as a model of such work. Popes have stated, that the spirit flows to all people from the heart of the Lord Jesus, Savior of the world, but certainly, no worker was ever more completely and profoundly penetrated by it than the St. Joseph, who lived with and guided Our Lord in the closest intimacy and community of family life and work."



## **Una vid, sus sarmientos y un viñador.**

Estimados hermanos de la comunidad latina en Lake Geneva:

¡Paz y Bien!

El Evangelio es siempre alegre noticia expresada con palabras e imágenes cotidianas y ricas de significado. En este Quinto Domingo de Pascua, las imágenes que se nos proponen parecieran no ser tan cercanas pues nuestra cultura a pesar de estar impregnada del ambiente del campo y de la siembra, no está tan familiarizada con el ambiente de la siembra de la vid o de la parra como se le conoce en otros lugares.

El evangelista Juan usando un lenguaje sencillo, nos presenta una vid con sus brotes cargados de racimos (es esto lo que significa sarmiento, son las ramas que se expanden desde el tallo y son las que finalmente sostienen las uvas) y a un agricultor que la trata con sus manos que conocen de la siembra y la tierra: es fabuloso este retrato que Jesús hace de sí mismo, de nosotros y del Padre.

No podemos tener miedo de un Dios así, que trabaja en mí con todo empeño para que me llene de jugosos frutos. Un Dios que me cuida, me toca, me guía, me poda. Un Dios que me quiere exuberante. No podemos tenerle miedo a un Dios así, podemos solo sonreír.

### **Cristo dice ser la vid y nosotros los sarmientos.**

Dice que somos la misma planta, la misma vida. Como creyentes estamos unidos a ese tallo fuerte y vigoroso, que empuja sin cesar la savia hacia mi último sarmiento, hasta el último brote, ya sea que duerma o esté en vigilia, no es un trabajo que dependa de mí.

### ***Mi padre es el viñador.***

Es un Dios campesino, que se pone a trabajar a mi alrededor, no sostiene el cetro sino el azadón, no se sienta en un trono, sino que va a la viña, para contemplarme emocionado con ojos de esperanza.

### ***Cada rama que da fruto la poda para dar más fruto.***

Podar la vid no significa amputar, sino quitar lo superfluo y dar fuerza; tiene como objetivo eliminar lo viejo y producir lo nuevo. Cualquier agricultor lo sabe: la poda es un regalo para la planta. Entonces mi Dios campesino me poda con un solo objetivo: el florecimiento de todo lo que es más hermoso y prometedor en mí.

Entre el tallo y los sarmientos (ramas) de la vid, la comunión la hace la savia que sube y se extiende hasta la última punta de la última hoja. Este es el amor de Dios que se extiende por todo el mundo, que circula por los campos y por todos los viñedos. Y lo hemos visto muchas veces haciendo florecer vidas que parecían haber terminado, reiniciar familias que parecían destruidas, alegrar corazones que parecían apagados.

"Estamos inmersos en un océano de amor y no nos damos cuenta" (G. Vannucci). Acude siempre a Dios que es una fuente inagotable, a la que siempre puedes recurrir y que nunca fallará.

Señor, ¡fluye dentro de mí! Tu que me quieres siempre más vivo y fecundo.
