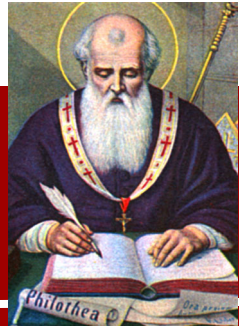


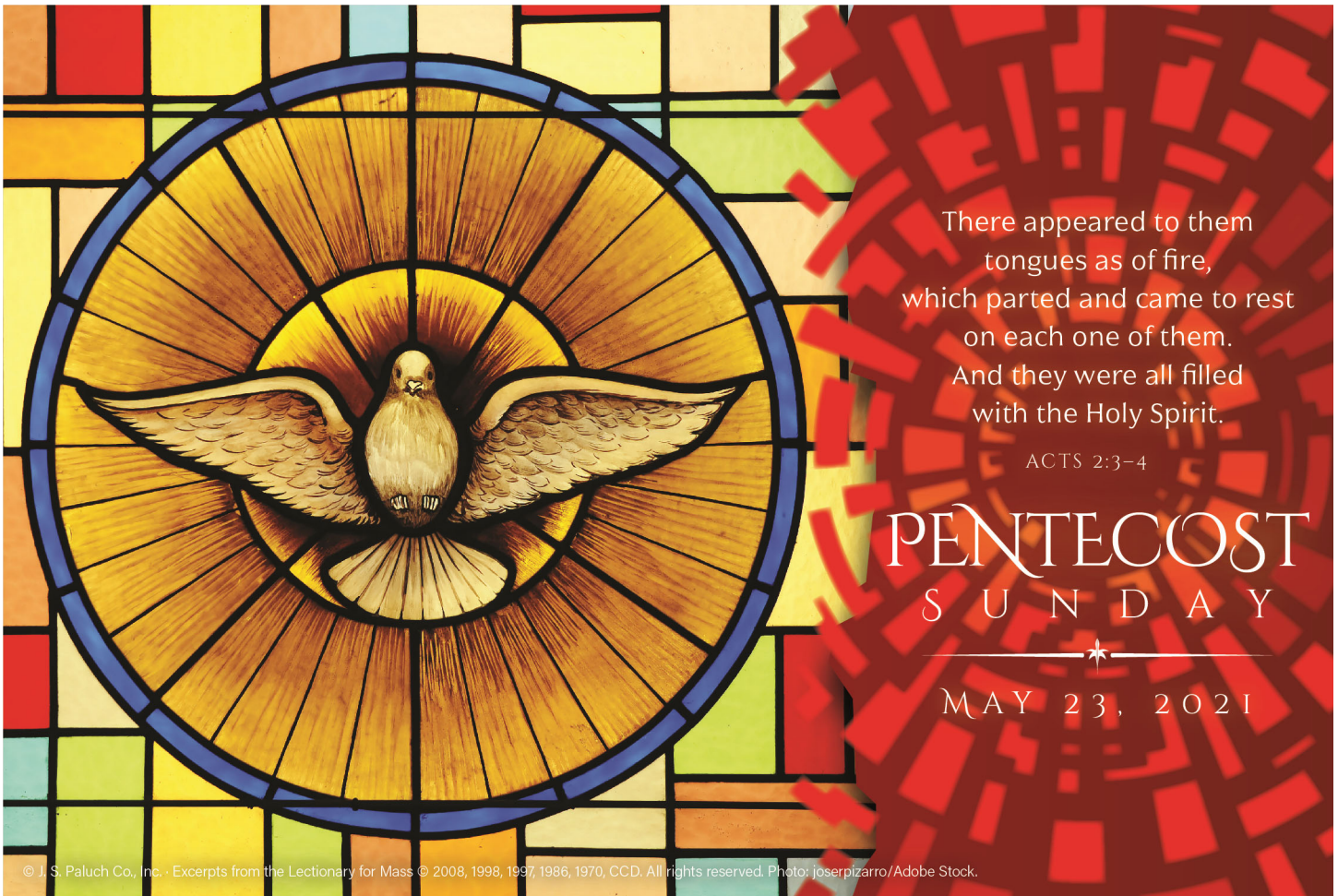

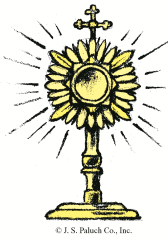

Changes in the Church Community beginning next Sunday the Feast of the Holy Trinity

1. Seating will become every pew in the main body of the Church, spaced seating will be found in the Chapel for those still wanting to keep the distance. Parish Center will be as spaced as people desire unless very full which will limit the ability to space. However, the Chapel seating will always be spaced. **PLEASE LEAVE CHAPEL SEATING TO THOSE WHO ARE CONCERNED ABOUT SPACING.**
2. Wearing of Mask when you come in will still be required. Once seated with family and friends unless you have a cold Mask can be removed and will NOT be required..
3. Communion lines in the main body of the Church will return. We will still bring Communion to those in the Chapel and the Parish Center.

Thank you for adhering to these regulations as we move into our next phases. No gathering meals, funeral luncheons, or breakfasts servings in the building will happen until September.

REFLECTION ON THE FEAST OF PENTECOST

Years ago I used to interview students who wanted a place in my class at the university. Every one of them had a resume that was 20 pages long. To be impressive you must have achievements. So, it is odd, that there is one, strangely anonymous, member of the Trinity.



God the Father, we know, almighty, creator of heaven and earth. God the Son, similarly has history; born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate... The Spirit, however, can sound like the poor relation of the Trinity, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints... In the Catechism it suggests that the Spirit never speaks of itself. It is very unusual never to speak of yourself, but it is what the Spirit does. Like a thief in the night you cannot see the Spirit but you can see where the Spirit has been. Which is why Jesus said: This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. (John 14:17)

As a Pastor with a school it can be a complicated place. At any given moment you might have twenty children practicing music in the church over there, while here are two earnest parishioners discussing the difference between a symbol on the wall. In the office a call is coming in about a baptism for the fourteenth time and here, in front of you, is someone in tears because a loved one has cancer. We try to tidy things up, however much of it is the work of the Spirit. When the thief in the night passes through he leaves behind one thing disorder. Where the Spirit has been what you get is abundance and variety.

Read Genesis and you will find that the Spirit gives abundance. Genesis starts with a formless abyss and the Spirit brings out of this abyss, something different: creation, and then something more. It is the same Spirit that has the apostles speaking in all those different tongues at Pentecost. The point about life in the Spirit is that it is rich and abundant and we should learn to enjoy that.

More importantly we should learn to trust it. Because, in the Spirit creation holds together - it does not fall apart. The great challenge is not that we should all end up the same, the challenge is that we should be different and enjoy it. The day of Pentecost is the day that we celebrate the fact that God gives us variety, gives us our extraordinary parish and community. Gives us the gifts, the imagination and the language to love both. In the Spirit we can forgive, explain, argue and be reconciled, we can co-operate, sympathize and love. The day of Pentecost is the day of variety and the opportunity to see that this is where the Spirit has been.

SOME SCRIPTURAL PASSAGES ON THE ROLE OF THE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Pentecost is the Feast of the birth of the Church because through the many gifts of the Holy Spirit,

we have become the image of Christ Jesus; the Body of Christ present in the world in order to continue the work of Creation: in building the Kingdom of God.



- To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues **1 Corinthians 12:8-10**

- The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him—the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORD—and he will delight in the fear of the LORD. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears;

Isaiah 11:2-3

- *For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us*

If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

Domingo de la Ascensión, Marcos 16, 15-20, ciclo B



A A la comunidad hispana de Lake Geneva:

En esta solemnidad de la Ascensión de Jesús, normalmente entendemos que subiendo a los cielos se separa por completo de nosotros, pero no es así, no se fue para siempre. En el Credo recitamos y creemos que el Señor subió a los cielos, pero según lo que leemos hoy parece que se quedó en lo más profundo de nosotros, pues dice el Evangelio: *"actuaba junto a ellos y confirmaba la Palabra con los signos que la acompañaban"* (Marcos 16, 20).

Jesús vuelve a llamar a un grupo de hombres asustados y confundidos, a un núcleo de mujeres valientes y fieles, y les confía el mundo de todos los días, con los problemas y sufrimientos que ya conocemos: *Y salieron y predicaron por todas partes ...* Y lo hace porque cree en ellos, a pesar de haber entendido poco, a pesar de haber traicionado y negado, y muchos todavía dudaban (Marcos 16, 11).

Y cuánta alegría debemos sentir al saber que Dios confía en nosotros, en nuestras manos, en nuestro corazón. Dios confía en tí más que tu mismo; Él sabe que eres capaz de contagiar a los que te rodean con su mensaje de alegría y de paz.

"El Señor actuaba con ellos", junto a ellos, con sus mismas obras. Es esta la última presentación de Jesús según el Evangelio de Marcos: **Él es fuerza que trabaja contigo de por vida, tu fuerza y la del Señor son una sola y solo hay buenos resultados.**

De ahora en adelante Él está contigo en cada gesto de bondad, cuando ofreces una palabra buena y viva, cuando construyes la paz, cuando das una mano al que lo necesita. En tus manos, sus manos; Existir es saber que Dios vive y trabaja en toda tu vida.

Es hermoso saber que cuando Jesús ha entrado al cielo, se llevó nuestra humanidad y ahí donde llegó El Pastor, llegará también su rebaño, cada uno de nosotros.

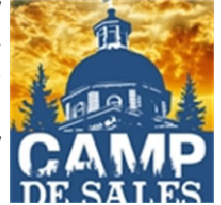
