

## Changes to the Participation in Mass and Confession

1. All pews in the main body of the church (the sanctuary) will be open for seating. This means you are free to sit where you would like when you enter for Mass.
2. The side chapel will have seats that are distanced from each other to allow for those who would still prefer to be seated in that fashion.
3. The seats in the parish center will remain set up as they have been for the last year.
4. When it is time for communion, those in the main body of the church will come forward in two lines and receive from the priest or Eucharistic minister.
5. For those in the side chapel and the parish center the priest or minister will still come to your seats.
6. Now that Archdiocesan guidelines allow for it, holy water will now be in both the baptismal font and the other holy water fonts throughout the church.
7. The main doors coming in from route 50 will now be open for entering and exiting.
8. The sacrament of confession will now be administered in the confessional off of the side chapel.
9. Masks are no longer required to attend Mass

## **OUR COMEBACK TO A TOTALLY OPEN COMMUNITY/CELEBRATION**

As I have mentioned in the Newsletter and other areas we will be opening things up logically. Some of the ministries that we do are not appropriate to open during the summer months because of the number of parishioners on vacation and the business of the summer with visiting, traveling and other activities. Especially this summer when so many were limited last summer.



Opening the Church, with Ministers, Seating, Music, Communion, and other aspects like that our easy to do. However, like gathering in the Parish Center after Sunday Masses must be organized with the whole group therefore we will wait for September. Funeral meals are also another area which we will hold off until September.

Ministries like Altar Servers carries two different aspects. First many of the servers were not trained to serve with myself, and as you know each Priest uses servers differently during the Liturgy. Consequently, training and assigning servers during the summer for our students doesn't work well. School Year YES! There are still a number of worries about receiving under both Species, (Bread & Wine). We will get back to that but give us time. Way too many concerns with that still! Visitations in the Church for a funeral we will get to when the Funeral Directors are ready to give supervision as before.

There are many questions but please give us time as we move forward. Just a reminder that as your new Administrator I had never seen the Parish before Covid. Second I may not be open to the way some things were done because of the problems they caused for the whole community before. We have organized a great Staff and they all are ready to move forward with guidance and creativity.

## FEAST OF THE SACRED HEART

The month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the highest human expression of divine love. Just this Friday, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus: the feast that sets the tone for the whole month. Popular piety highly prizes symbols, and the Heart of Jesus is the ultimate symbol of God's mercy - but it is not an imaginary symbol, it is a real symbol, which represents the center, the source from which salvation for all humanity gushed forth.



In the Gospels we find several references to the Heart of Jesus, for example, in the passage where Christ says, "Come unto me, all you that labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart."

Then there is the key story of the death of Christ according to John. John testifies to what he saw on Calvary: that a soldier, when Jesus was already dead, pierced his side with a spear, and from the wound flowed blood and water. John recognized in that the fulfillment of prophecies: from the heart of Jesus, the Lamb slain on the cross, flow forgiveness and life for all people.

But the mercy of Jesus is not just sentiment: it is a force that gives life, that raises us up! The Gospel story in the episode of the widow of Nain reflects this image. Jesus, with his disciples, is just arrived in Nain, a village in Galilee, at the very moment in which a funeral is taking place. a boy is buried, the only son of a widow. Jesus' gaze immediately fixes itself on the weeping mother. The evangelist Luke says: "Seeing her, the Lord was moved with great compassion for her." This "compassion" is the love of God for humanity, it is mercy: the attitude of God in contact with human misery, with our poverty, our suffering, our anguish.

The biblical term "compassion" recalls the maternal essence: a mother, experiences a reaction all her own, to the pain of her children. In this way does God love us, the Scripture says. And what is the fruit of this love? It is life! Jesus said to the widow of Nain, "Do not weep," and then called the dead boy and awoke him as from a sleep. The mercy of God gives life to humanity, it raises us from the dead. The Lord is always watching us with mercy, always awaits us with mercy. Let us be not afraid to approach him! He has a merciful heart! If we show our inner wounds, our sins, He always forgives us. He is pure mercy! Let us never forget this: He is pure mercy! Let us go to Jesus!




### Volunteers Needed:

## The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ



St. Thomas Aquinas after his many years of writings on the theological concept of Transubstantiation and the transformative prayers of the Liturgy in which Bread and Wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, strongly supported this Feast day which then was called the Feast of Corpus Christi. At the time contrary to modern thinking; many Catholics struggled comprehending how the Bread and Wine at Liturgy became the Body and Blood of Christ. This was at a time when the wrangling between illiteracy among the People. Followed with how many tabernacles in the local community Catholic Churches were made of wood, with metals too expensive for the average local Catholic Parish unlike many of the great Churches in the major metropolitan areas. Leading to the consecrated host molding, hardening and sometimes even eaten by critters that chipped away at the wood getting into the tabernacle.

Recall that this struggle to understand or at least comprehend existed many years before the Protestant Reformation. Many of the faithful vacillated with the full doctrinal understanding of the Consecration because of the issues mentioned above. Right before St. Thomas' period, there were discussions on what words would be used to explain what happens to the Bread and Wine during the Consecration. Catholicism through the writings of St. Thomas Aquinas and his philosophical and theological explanations chose the word Transubstantiation. Having selected this philosophical and theological term, the Church then specifically calls the Bread and Wine transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ: Real Presence.

There is a reason why that term Real Presence is used if you absolutely understand the true meaning of Transubstantiation. Most Catholics because they learn about the consecration in second and third grade never come to understand Real Presence as the Doctrine and Theology of the Roman Catholic Church expresses in its teachings. I always taught my college students that if the average Catholic fully understood Transubstantiation I believe there would be very few who would question the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. But because so many have a grade school understanding of Real Presence they tend to question or unfortunately even reject the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Unfortunately, Real Presence and its theological and philosophical, as well doctrinal teachings are not material for a homily because of its complexities it is the type of discussion that needs feedback as seen in St. Thomas' Summa. All I can definitely and powerfully express: Jesus is truly present in the Bread and Wine that become his Body and Blood.

Why did we change the name of the Feast from Corpus Chrsiti? Corpus Christi means, "Body of Christ." As Catholics became more educated in theology there were great distinctions that developed between the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ in writings and devotions. Some Catholics began to believe that you did not receive the fullness of Christ unless you received both the Host and the Cup at Mass. However, our teaching has always been that you receive the fullness of Christ in either species (Bread or Wine). Even though the act of receiving both; symbolically is more powerful to the community. The Real Presence is not symbolic, but the act of receiving both. Thus it is better to call this the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, so that distinction doesn't permeate itself in Catholic Teaching.

A final point is why did St. Thomas Aquinas push for this Feast if Holy Thursday is the Institution of the Eucharist. As many theologians stated, there are many elements celebrated on Holy Thursday, like the institution of priesthood in service to the Christ as seen in the act of the Washing of the Feet. This Sunday is solely centered on the Eucharist itself. A Blessed Feast to All. For Christ truly is present to all Creation.
