



Changes to the Participation in Mass and Confession (Effective May 29-30, 2021)

1. All pews in the main body of the church (the sanctuary) will be open for seating. This means you are free to sit where you would like when you enter for Mass.
2. The side chapel will have seats that are distanced from each other to allow for those who would still prefer to be seated in that fashion.
3. The seats in the parish center will remain set up as they have been for the last year.
4. When it is time for communion, those in the main body of the church will come forward in two lines and receive from the priest or Eucharistic minister.
5. For those in the side chapel and the parish center the priest or minister will still come to your seats.
6. Now that Archdiocesan guidelines allow for it, holy water will now be in both the baptismal font and the other holy water fonts throughout the church.
7. The main doors coming in from route 50 will now be open for entering and exiting.
8. The sacrament of confession will now be administered in the confessional off of the side chapel.
9. Masks are no longer required to attend Mass

IT IS NOT GOOD FOR GOD TO BE ALONE' (G K CHESTERTON)

The Trinity is the defining doctrine of Christian faith, the central statement about the kind of God we believe in. We are baptized “*in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit*” and begin our formal and informal prayers with this Trinitarian formula. Yet, in 1970, the great German theologian, Karl

Rahner, made this surprising comment: ‘*Despite their orthodox confession of the Trinity, Christians are, in their practical life, almost mere monotheists.*’

What Rahner meant: the doctrine of the Trinity was, for most Christians, a matter of a formal profession of faith with little or no impact on their day-to-day life. Just how irrelevant this doctrine can seem is borne out from a Catechist years ago. He was explaining why he had decided to omit any reference to the Trinity in a catechism he was writing for the use of catechists in his parish. He had omitted the Trinity, he said, because it was ‘*too complicated. To mention it would only confuse the people.*’

But perhaps there is another reason why the Trinity has not had much impact on our everyday lives. Traditionally, God was seen as immutable, unlimited, and all perfect, far removed from the world of creaturely imperfection. The relationship between God and the world was presented as a one-way relationship. God, we were told, could not be affected or moved by anything that happens in the world – an unmoved mover. To many God appear remote or distant from us. But surely this is not the God revealed in the life and ministry of Jesus.

The God of Jesus is a God who goes in search of men and women and rejoices when a lost son finds his way back to the house of his Father. The parable of the Prodigal Son portrays God as a loving Father who responds to human decisions and is affected by them. The God of the Bible is not remote, aloof, indifferent, self-enclosed, perfect Being, but a loving Father who is interested in and cares for each person, from the smallest to the greatest – a passionate and compassionate God, capable of being deeply moved by the sufferings of his creatures. In the words of Pope Francis, the Scriptures reveal a ‘*God of Love who created the universe and generated a people, became flesh, died and rose for us, and, as the Holy Spirit, transforms everything and brings it to fullness*’ – a God who is Father, Son and Spirit.

However, the doctrine of the Trinity is not just about God’s eternal being. It is as much about us as it is about God, about how God relates with us and how we should relate with one another. ‘*The life of God – precisely because God is triune – does not belong to God alone. God who dwells in inaccessible light and eternal glory comes to us in the face of Christ and the activity of the Holy Spirit... The heart of the Christian life is to be united to the God of Jesus Christ by means of a communion with one another.* A Blessed Feast of the Holy Trinity: of Father, Son and Spirit, generating within us the love of God, Others and Self.



MEMORIAL DAY MEANDERING

This weekend is Memorial Day and for too many Americans it is only a special day off and time for picnics. So why do we celebrate Memorial Day? Memorial Day is considered a federal holiday in the United States in which we honor and mourn members of the military who have died while serving in the United States Armed Forces. This is not to be confused with Veterans Day.



Memorial Day honors military personnel who died in the service of their country. More specifically, it honors those who died in battle or as a result of wounds they sustained during battle. Veteran’s Day honors all who have served in the Armed Forces in any way who are both living and dead. Memorial day also reminds us of a time of division and struggle specifically North against South, and later Europeans against American Immigrants (just ask any German American during World War I or Japanese American during World War II). So, where did Memorial Day come from?

Originally known as Decoration Day, Memorial Day began with an idea from General John Logan, as a way to honor the fallen soldiers of the Civil War. The first celebration on May 30, 1868, was held at Arlington National Cemetery with a crowd of 5,000 people decorating the graves of over 20,000 military personnel with flowers. Various Washington officials, including General Ulysses S. Grant, presided over the ceremonies.

After speeches, children from the Soldiers’ and Sailors’ Orphan Home, among others, made their way through the cemetery, strewing flowers on both Union and Confederate graves, reciting prayers, and singing hymns. Many also came prepared with a picnic lunch. The observance has since been expanded to remember the deceased soldiers of any and all wars. It wasn’t until after World War I that Memorial Day was expanded to honor all veterans who died in any American war.

In 1971, Decoration Day became officially known as Memorial Day and Congress passed an act declaring it a national holiday. Let us remember all of our deceased Men and Women of the Armed Forces who gave their life that we can truly be the land of the Free and Brave. God Bless them always with Life everlasting. Amen.

BOLETÍN INFORMATIVO COMUNIDAD HISPANA



Jesús conmigo hasta el fin de los tiempos.

Domingo de la Santísima
Trinidad – Mateo 28, 16-20

A la comunidad hispana de Lake
Geneva: Paz y Bien

La Palabra de hoy nos habla de una última cita que tiene Jesús resucitado con los discípulos. Hasta ahora, el evangelista nos dice que solo un grupo de mujeres ha visto al Resucitado, quienes reciben el mandato de avisar a los discípulos de ir a Galilea, porque allí *lo verán*. Y ellos se ponen en camino.

Mateo hace notar que son solo once. Son la primera comunidad eclesial marcada por la traición, son una **comunidad imperfecta**. El texto dice que les da cita en *El monte*, en Galilea, (no en un monte, sino en *el monte*) por lo que podemos pensar que se trata de un lugar específico que ya antes conocían, de ser así, podemos pensar que se trató del monte de las bienaventuranzas, donde Jesús había ya presentado el distintivo propio que animaría a los que lo siguen: *“Dichosos, felices, bienaventurados los pobres, los mansos, los que lloran, los que tienen hambre y sed de justicia...”*, ahí donde la lógica del mundo, con su engañosa receta de felicidad y autorrealización, quedó hecha trizas. Y bien, los discípulos vuelven a este lugar para ver al Señor resucitado.

Y *“al verlo, lo adoraron”*. El texto nos dice además algo muy peculiar: *“algunos dudaron”*.

¿Por qué la duda cuando están ante la prueba física más clara y contundente de la resurrección?

Es interesante ver cómo *-a diferencia de nosotros-* Jesús no se asusta de esta duda. No reprende, no regaña. Simplemente se les *acerca*, les habla, y les confía una misión: *“Vayan y hagan discípulos todas las gentes, bautizándolas en el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo, enseñándoles a guardar todo lo que yo les he mandado”*.

“Bautizar” significa sumergir, de manera que la persona quede completamente rodeada por el agua. Por lo que el mandato de bautizar que da Jesús mira a que ayudemos a todas las personas a que se *sumerjan* en el amor de Dios, a que se empapen de la vida de Dios Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo.

“Estoy con ustedes siempre”. Son las últimas palabras de Jesús, El Dios con nosotros anunciado por los profetas, es una realidad viva, que nos acompaña en el diario quehacer, en las pruebas, el temor a la enfermedad y a la muerte. El nombre de Dios es promesa y compañía. En esto estamos llamados a creer todos los días. De esto estamos llamados a dar testimonio.

Sin embargo, los asientos de la Capilla siempre estarán espaciados. **POR FAVOR DEJE LOS ASIENTOS DE CAPILLA A LOS QUE ESTÁN PREOCUPADOS POR EL ESPACIO.**
2. Aún será necesario el uso de la máscara cuando entre a la iglesia. Una vez sentado con familiares y amigos, a menos que tenga gripa o enfermo, puede quitarse la máscara y NO será necesaria.
3. Volverán las filas de comunión en el cuerpo principal de la Iglesia. Todavía llevaremos la Comunión a los que están en la Capilla y el Centro Parroquial. Gracias por adherirse a estas regulaciones a medida que avanzamos hacia nuestras próximas fases. No habrá comidas de reunión, almuerzos funerales ni desayunos en el centro parroquial hasta septiembre.
