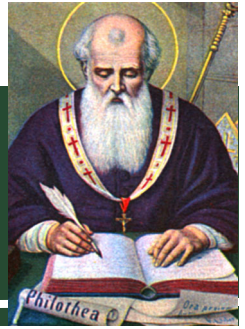

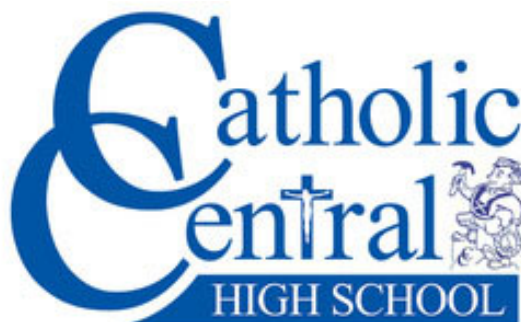

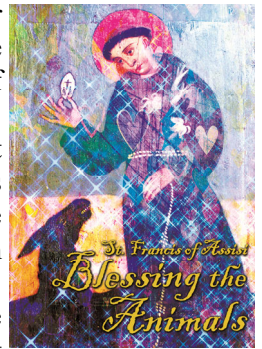

RESPECT LIFE MONTH

As we enter the elections this coming Month it is appropriate that we celebrate Respect Life month beginning this weekend and all through the month of October. Here at St. Francis each Sunday Liturgy will begin with the lighting of a Candle in the Sanctuary as a reminder of Respect Life Month. Christ is the Light that guides us through Sin and Death so we will have that reminder at all of our weekend Masses. I would like to share a Letter from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops dealing with Respect Life Month:

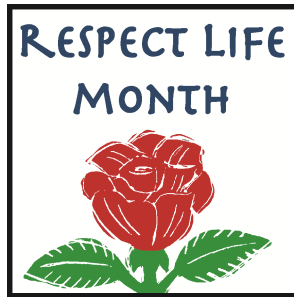
As Catholics in the United States, we mark our annual observance of October as Respect Life Month. It is a time to focus on God's precious gift of human life and our responsibility to care for, protect, and defend the lives of our brothers and sisters.

"This year's theme, 'Live the Gospel of Life,' was inspired by the commemoration of the 25th anniversary of Pope John Paul II's encyclical, [The Gospel of Life](#). Pope John Paul's masterfully articulated defense of the right to life for children in their mothers' wombs, the elderly, persons with disabilities, and the marginalized is more relevant today than ever before.

"Last November, the U.S. bishops reaffirmed that 'the threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed.' While we noted not to 'dismiss or ignore other serious threats to human life and dignity such as racism, the environmental crisis, poverty, and the death penalty,' we renewed our commitment to protect the most fundamental of all human rights – the right to live.

"This past January, I shared with Pope Francis that the bishops of the United States had been criticized by some for identifying the protection of the unborn as a preeminent priority. The Holy Father expressed his support for our efforts observing that if we fail to protect life, no other rights matter. Pope Francis also said that abortion is not primarily a Catholic or even a religious issue, it is first and foremost a human rights issue.

"The Gospel of Life provides a blueprint for building a culture of life and civilization of love. The important work of transforming our culture begins by allowing the Gospel of Christ to touch and transform our own hearts and the decisions we make. May we strive to imitate Christ and follow in his footsteps, caring for the most vulnerable among us. Through the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe, may Our Lord grant us the grace to live courageously and faithfully his Gospel of life."

SOLES FOR CATHOLIC EDUCATION WALK GOES VIRTUAL IN 2020

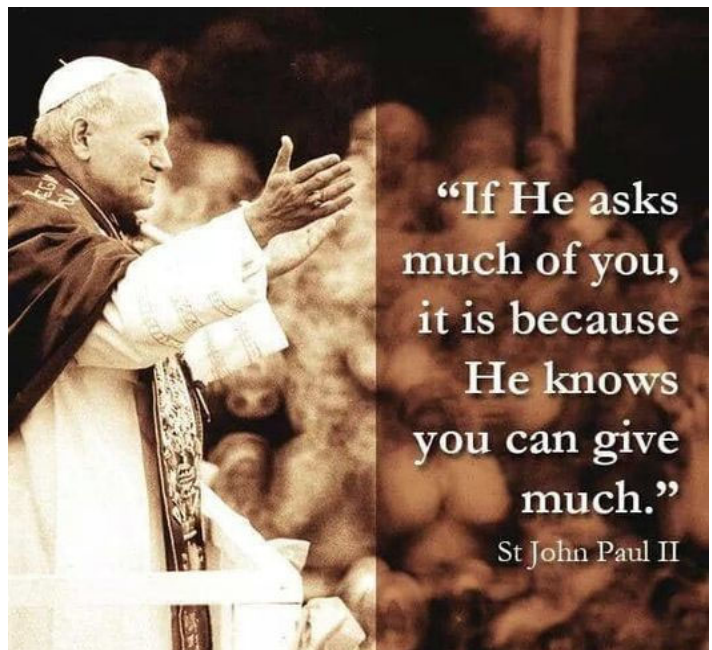
The annual Soles for Catholic Education Walk is going virtual in 2020, but will still provide your parish school an opportunity to raise funds that benefit directly students and classrooms. On Saturday, Oct. 17, 2020, parish schools will have the option as to whether to organize a walk on parish grounds, in area neighborhoods or to encourage students and parents to design their own routes (considering safety first, of course).

This year's virtual Soles Walk will provide your parish school an opportunity to raise much-needed funds that will directly benefit your classrooms and students. Each school will set their own fundraising goal for items needed, and will decide how and where walkers will participate.

To help each school raise money, there are several new and exciting additions:

1. Matching funds: This year's sponsorship donations will be used to match a portion of the money raised by each school. The percentage of matching funds received will be based proportionally on how much the schools raise compared to how much is donated by sponsors.

THE CATHOLIC COMEBACK - PHASE 2

Dear brothers and sisters,

The weekend of the 19th and 20th of September marked an unprecedented time for us as Catholics in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Archbishop Jerome ListECKI updated some of the guidelines on our Catholic Comeback Matrix, making effective on Sept. 14 that we moved to phase 2; and he indicated that the dispensation from the obligation of Catholics to attend Sunday Mass, which he had provided since last March, was no longer to be extended beyond the weekend of Sept. 12 & 13.

The Church joyfully proclaims in the Second Vatican Council that “the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian Life” (LG 11) Contrary to popular beliefs of the contemporary world, it is very unlikely that one, who is Catholic, can maintain, and live the Catholic faith and yet not attend Sunday Mass or receive the Eucharist and the other Sacraments. Now every person who calls themselves Catholic has the responsibility to prayerfully evaluate their return to Mass. While it is certainly my hope that more and more of our parishioners will return to Mass, it does not mean that all should immediately return. This is the guidance from our Archbishop:

“If a person is at risk because of age, underlying medical conditions or a compromised immune system, one would be excused from the obligation. If a person is caring for a sick person, even if they are not sick, they would be excused from the obligation out of charity. Fear of getting sick, in and of itself, does not excuse someone from the obligation. However, if the fear is generated because of at-risk factors, such as pre-existing conditions, age or compromised immune systems, then the fear would be sufficient to excuse from the obligation.”

As we return safely to Mass again, let me share with you some of the ways we are going to keep everyone safe:

- If you have any flu like symptoms, please stay home.
- Face masks are required and please use hand sanitizer, at least, as you come in and before receiving Holy Communion.
- Please sit only in the mark pews and please fill the front pews first.
- If you are a family of 4 or more please sit in a pew that is empty, leaving the other pews for individuals to sit 6 feet apart as the share a pew with a person who is not from the same household.
- During the Sign of Peace, please wave or do a simple head vow to other parishioners who do not live with you in the same household. You can shake hands or do another physical gesture only with people who live with you in the same house.
- For Communion, please stay in your pew. The priest or the Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC) will come to you. If you are receiving Communion, please feel free to stand or kneel. Please receive reverently the Body of Christ only in your hands and consume Him right away. If you are not receiving Holy Communion, please sit and crossed your arms over your chest as the priest or EMHC walk by.
- If you want to bring Holy communion to a family member at home, please bring a pyx and present it open at the time you receive the Body of Christ.
- Confessions will be offer on Saturdays from 4:00 pm until 4:45pm and also after weekday 7:30am Masses right after Mass
- After a couple of weekends, we will reevaluate if we need to add another Mass depending on numbers of parishioners returning.

Please, be patient and cooperative with our requests, directions, and expectations. All are intended for your well-being and safety. All of us have different opinions and experiences with this pandemic, so please let us be respectful of the different levels of comfort that each will demonstrate during this time.

For my brothers and sisters who would not be coming to Mass in our parish, we will continue to record the Mass and making it available for the weekend, if the technology cooperates.

And as people of faith, let us continue to keep each other in prayer and ask the intercession of Saint Michael the Archangel for the end to this pandemic: St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls.
