





LETTER FROM OUR ARCHBISHOP ON THE ELECTIONS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we approach our national election and ponder the privilege we have as citizens to vote, I encourage all of you to read the directions given by the USCCB as a voter's guide. I urge you to be informed about the issues that the Catholic Church and its social teachings place before us. I wish to emphasize the following issues and why they are extremely important to me as a Catholic and a patriotic citizen.

The first issue is **religious freedom**. As a religious leader, I am more and more convinced that there is a concerted effort being waged to limit the impact of organized religion. This has been true for the last decade with the push toward secularism. Religion, especially the Catholic Church, stands at the forefront in opposition to the social reconstruction that is marketed as a progressive doctrine and deems religion and its teachings as offensive and backward. Will homilies be scrutinized for politically correct positions? Will churches be the subject of interference in their social outreach, being evaluated by whether they carry the banner of political ideologies? We have a higher responsibility which makes us better citizens and more responsible human beings.

I am unabashedly **pro-life**. The second concern is respect for life from womb to tomb. I am convinced that we will not return to a positive attitude in our country until we protect life, especially the lives of the unborn. The protection of our rights is only as secure as the protection of the rights of the most vulnerable among us, and there is little doubt that the most vulnerable are the unborn. A focus on the "life issues" will give strength to all other social issues. You cannot be pro-social justice if you are not first rooted in respect for life. All of the social issues can only be addressed if you are alive. The aborted unborn are souls whose fulfillment has been denied.

The third issue is the **economy and schools**. Strong families emerge from economic stability. We need a strong economy supported by a growing middle class. Much of the unrest and inequality exists because of the denial of certain economic opportunities. Every parent should have access to good education choices for their children, and the government should offer these choices. Additionally, training programs that educate men and women in the areas of trades and technology are necessary. The poor have a possibility for social movement through education and economic opportunities. We should support those educational and economic reforms.

The fourth issue of concern for me is our **national debt**. How can one even wrap their mind around \$27 trillion in debt? It is real and needs to be addressed. I am sorry if I exhibit my blue-collar background, but you should not spend what you do not have. I realize that there are values to production and earning potentials. However, if there is not enough in the piggy bank, or enough hours in a day to work for pay, then you must live within your means. This must also be true for the government. All promises made for the special benefits of the people become valueless if there is no money to fulfill them. I have always found it disingenuous when people flippantly say, "Just kick the can down the road," leaving the problem for future generations. We created it. We own it; not our children.

The fifth issue is **security, both nationally and domestically**. We should address our internal security against the forces of terrorism and the arbitrary violence which disrupts social harmony, as well as the national defense which protects us from foreign enemies. We are facing a world which not only must be prepared to encounter bullets, but also cyber technology and biochemical warfare as well. I am grateful and supportive of our first responders, the police, fire and emergency personnel who rush to defend vulnerable citizens and allow us to sleep soundly every night. We cannot be so naïve and unaware of the foreign enemies who desire to hurt and even destroy America and its way of Life. Recently, this has been not only foreign but domestic as well. America cannot afford to abdicate its leadership in the world community, and can only do so with a strong and stable American society.

Many may ask why I did not offer other specific issues such as racism, immigration, foreign relations, universal health care, etc. Certainly, there is no end to social issues. However, for these issues to be properly addressed, they must have a foundation of respect for the dignity of life, opportunity to succeed, a strong economy, a sense of security and, of course, an expression of God's presence in our lives. They systemically affect the nation and its future.

I am a committed Catholic, and I love our country. I will always be a faithful citizen, respecting our Constitution and following Christ's command to LOVE ONE ANOTHER.



ALL SOUL'S DAY REFLECTION



All Soul's Day marks the final day of Allhallowtide, as we celebrate those members of the Body of Christ who have gone from this life. We conclude our celebration of the communion of saints by giving prayers rather than receiving them. On All Saints Day, we honored the Saints—all of those in heaven—for their example of faithfulness in every time and place. Today, we offer our prayers for all those who have died and have not yet reached heaven. All those who die in God's grace and friendship, but

who are still imperfect, receive salvation, but only after undergoing a purification.

This purification—called in the Catholic tradition, purgatory—prepares them to achieve the perfect holiness and union with God that is heaven. In his *Commedia*, Italian poet Dante Alegheri goes on a journey through hell, up through purgatory, to paradise. While Dante's *Inferno* (his journey through hell) is perhaps the most popularly well-known of the books of the *Commedia*, the two following poems, *Purgatorio* and *Paradiso* are both some of the most theologically profound poetry ever penned and two of the great artistic literary meditations on God's love and divine mercy. In Canto XXIII of the *Purgatorio*, on the sixth terrace of Mount Purgatory where the gluttonous are being cleansed of their sin. Dante encounters his friend Forese, who speaks to Dante of the purifying action of Purgatory. The love of God compels them to journey around and around the mountain constantly. Their purification is painful, but:

*as we go round this space, our pain's renewed—
I speak of pain but I should speak of solace,
for we are guided to those trees by that same wish
Which led the Christ rejoicing to say "Eli,"
When with his veins he liberated us."*

(lines 70-75, Mandelbaum/Longfellow translations)

What purifies them is not the wrath of God; their pain does not come from divine anger. Rather, these souls are experiencing the pain of love—the salvific love of God that led Christ to offer himself up, in love, on the cross. Purgatory is a beautiful illustration of this image of divine love: love that will not rest until each of us is entirely made new in Christ. As attested to by the practice of offering Eucharistic liturgy at *martyria*, one of the oldest Christian traditions of our faith is to pray for the dead—we've always offered prayers and the Mass for those who, like Forese, are in the crucible of purification for the final happiness of heaven.

All Saints Day and All Souls Day and the small triduum of Allhallowtide remind us that we are part of a family that is wider and deeper than our physical world. This family of faith is a reality by which we are connected with all of the faithful who have tried to walk in the way of Christ through the ages. This is our community of faith. In Christ, we all form one mystical body.

Let us take a moment today to offer a prayer for those who have died but who have not yet reached the full glory of paradise, who still, like us, only taste its beauty and pain as it purifies our hearts on our pilgrimage to our final, heavenly end. Let us remember all of those from our parish who have died, and all the faithful departed. On the feast of All Souls' Day, let us pray also for the souls in Purgatory and all the faithful departed, especially those from our St. Francis de Sales family and our own families.

NOVEMBER 4TH; FEAST OF ST. CHARLES BORROMEO



The name of St. Charles Borromeo is associated with reform. He lived during the time of the Protestant Reformation, and had a hand in the reform of the whole Church during the final years of the Council of Trent. Although he belonged to the Milanese nobility and was related to the powerful Medici family, Charles desired to devote himself to the Church.

In 1559, when his uncle, Cardinal de Medici was elected Pope Pius IV, he made Charles cardinal-deacon and administrator of the Archdiocese of Milan. At the time Charles was still a layman and a young student. Because of his intellectual qualities Charles was entrusted with several important offices connected with the Vatican, and later appointed secretary of state with responsibility for the papal states.

The untimely death of his elder brother brought Charles to a definite decision to be ordained a priest, despite his relatives' insistence that he marry. Soon after being ordained a priest at age 25, Borromeo was consecrated bishop of Milan. Working behind the scenes, Saint Charles deserves the credit for keeping the Council of Trent in session when at several points it was on the verge of breaking up. Borromeo encouraged the pope to renew the Council in 1562, after it had been suspended for 10 years. He took upon himself the task of the entire correspondence during the final phase. Because of his work at the Council, Borromeo was unable to take up residence in Milan until the Council concluded.

Eventually, Borromeo was allowed to devote his time to the Archdiocese of Milan, where the religious and moral picture was far from bright. The reform needed in every phase of Catholic life among both clergy and laity was initiated at a provincial council of all the bishops under him. Specific regulations were drawn up for bishops and other clergy: If the people were to be converted to a better life, Borromeo had to be the first to give a good example and renew their apostolic spirit. Charles took the initiative in giving a good example. He allotted most of his income to charity, forbade himself all luxury, and imposed severe penances upon himself. He sacrificed wealth, high honors, esteem, and influence to become poor.

During the plague and famine of 1576, Borromeo tried to feed 60,000 to 70,000 people daily. To do this he borrowed large sums of money that required years to repay. Whereas the civil authorities fled at the height of the plague, he stayed in the city, where he ministered to the sick and the dying, helping those in want. Work and the heavy burdens of his high office began to affect Archbishop Borromeo's health, leading to his death at the age of 46.
