




Catholic Press Month comes at an appropriate time as we find ourselves huddled around the fires of our homes as outside the winds and snows, blow and fall ushering in the Arctic Blast of Winter. This Scene calling us to a good book either in hardcover, paperback, eBook, Kindle or whatever form we read with as we are wrapped in the warm comforter.



There are many great Presses out there which support our Catholic understanding in Liturgy, Scripture, Theology, Devotionals, Lives of the Saints, Prayer and Meditations, Family Life, Vocations, Social Justice and even just wonderful Novels such as from two of my Favorite Authors many years ago like John Powers (Do Black Patent Leather Shoes Really Reflect Up?) dealing with Southside Irish Catholics in Chicago in a fun and enjoyable way. Finally, Graham Greene with his The Power and the Glory about a Catholic Priests struggle to be active in the world as God called his apostles, and yet struggling with one's own demons.

Personally I try to read about six books a month but I never recommend the books I love because they are the types of books that half the page you read is that actual writing and the rest is footnotes. And because of the importance of the footnotes to the reading they are not at the end of the Chapter but on the same page. One of my best Friends always said the footnotes are a book in themselves.

What I would like to suggest is the various Presses like Ascension Press, Ignatius Press, Liturgical Press, Baker Press, Ave Maria Press, Liguori Publications, Loyola Press, Pauline Press, Sophia Press, Paulist Press as the leading Presses. Each of these Presses concentrates on a different area. LTP out of Chicago has many small pamphlets that give some quick and wonderful information. During this winter month find a book to learn more of our Faith.

ASH WEDNESDAY

The Lenten Season is approaching rapidly with Ash Wednesday being February 17th. Because Ash Wednesday is not like a regular Feast Day in the way of what is called anticipatory celebrations also in Catholic Liturgical Language: Vigil Masses, all Ash Wednesday Masses must happen on the same day.

Therefore, our schedule is set up to both facilitate the needs of the Parish and our School. Some of you may notice that our Tuesday and Thursday daily Masses are later than our other two Masses on Wednesday and Friday. That is because we had to split our Catholic School Masses on two separate days to accommodate with the restrictions of Covid safety.

So when looking at our Ash Wednesday Schedule of the four Masses we have two are School Masses. Adults are allowed at these two Masses but are not allowed in the main body of the Church. As all our Educators and Medical personal know, we must keep the areas separate because of the children's safety and needs. Having said that there is seating for about thirty adults at each school Masses. The Ritual for Ash Wednesday is as Follow.

1. We will have the Blessing of the Ashes followed by the prayer over the Community
2. The Prayer will be the usual words spoken when Ashes are placed on the forehead with the Sign of the Cross
3. As in many countries in Europe and as directed by the United States Council of Bishops, after Mass we will have a light sprinkling of Ashes on the head only. No physical signing with the "Sign of the Cross" on the forehead.


WE ARE CALLED... LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES FOR GIVING

Almsgiving – an unfamiliar word to many – it is more than just donating/ giving money to those in need. Its meaning is based on prayer and fasting, when we reflect on the needs of others; which then leads us to give from our hearts to those in need; whether they are in a foreign country or our own town, neighborhood or Parish. The Human Concerns committee will be offering opportunities to bring various items each weekend of Lent to help those in need in our own Lake Geneva community.

We are blessed to have these opportunities. Just remember, none of us can do everything, but everyone can do something. We are blessed to be a blessing.



ST. SCHOLASTIC



Most people are more familiar with St. Benedict because the Benedictine order and monasteries bear his name. St. Scholastica was St. Benedict's twin sister. They lived in the 5th century. At an early age, Scholastica entered a convent joining a Benedictine order for women. The Benedictine motto *ora*

et labora (pray and work) became a real joy for the young abbess, for she had practiced it since childhood. She found it the best way to keep her mind occupied with God even though her duties as abbess kept her busy most of the day.

Pope Gregory explained that, although Benedict had set out a rule of life for these holy women, it was Scholastica's duty to see that they kept it faithfully, cheerfully and regarded it as the best means for their sanctification. Each year, Benedict and Scholastica met to discuss their way of life and the various spiritual challenges in the two religious houses. Since women were not allowed to enter his monastery, Benedict and a few companions met her in the guest house at Monte Casino.

One day when Scholastica was very ill, her brother came to visit her at the convent. They spent the day singing psalms and speaking about the spiritual life, its compensations and challenges. When evening came, they sat down to supper and continued the conversation until quite late. Strict orders of the monastery only allowed one day for a monk to visit his family and never allowed him to stay away overnight. After a delightful day of visiting, Scholastica asked her brother to stay the night since she was afraid that she would not live until his next visit. Benedict, an obedient monk, would not hear of such a thing.

Legend has it that Scholastica folded her hands in prayer. When she looked up a minute later, lightning flashed in the sky, thunder roared ominously, and such a downpour of rain began that Benedict and his monks could not safely leave the house. Realizing what had happened, Benedict reproached her: "What have you done, my sister?" Scholastica answered simply, "I asked a favor of you, and you refused to listen to me. So I asked my God, and He, more generous than you, granted my request." Once again Scholastica's pleas won the favor she was seeking.

FEAST OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES FEBRUARY 11TH

The Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes in southern France is the most visited pilgrimage site in the world — principally because of the apparent healing properties of the waters of the spring that appeared during the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary to a poor, fourteen-year-old girl, Bernadette Soubiroux. The first apparition occurred February 11, 1858. There were eighteen in all; the last took place July 16, of the same year.



The mysterious vision Bernadette saw in the hollow of the rock Massabielle, where she and friends had gone to gather firewood, was that of a young and beautiful lady. "Lovelier than I have ever seen" said the child. She described the Lady as clothed in white, with a blue ribbon sash and a Rosary hanging from her right arm. Now and then the apparition spoke to Bernadette.

One day, the Lady told the girl to drink of a mysterious fountain within the grotto itself, the existence of which was unknown, and of which there was no sign. But Bernadette scratched at the ground, and a spring immediately bubbled up and soon gushed forth. One apparition bade Bernadette go and tell the priests she wished a chapel to be built on the spot and processions to be made to the grotto. At first the clergy were incredulous. The priest said he would not believe it unless the apparition gave Bernadette her name. That name she was told: "I am the Immaculate Conception". A basilica was built upon the rock of Massabielle.

In 1873 the great "national" French pilgrimages were inaugurated. Pope Leo XIII authorized a special office and a Mass, in commemoration of the apparition, and in 1907 Pius X extended the observance of this feast to the entire Church now observed on February 11.

CATHOLIC MARRIAGE WEEK



This week we begin Catholic Marriage week! As our Bishops have stated. “The basic cell of society is the family, founded upon marriage. We the Catholic bishops of the United States recognize the importance of promoting holy and healthy marriages.”

Our Parish of St. Francis de Sales is a hub for many weddings throughout the Southeast region of Wisconsin, Northeastern Illinois and from throughout the whole country. We have a number of weekends in which we have two to three weddings. The celebration of National Marriage means much more for us at St. Francis de Sales because of the multiple couples who come here to celebrate that Blessed and Holy Sacrament.

We know here in our Parish that National Marriage week as the Bishops’ Conference states is definitely about our understanding of Catholic “teaching regarding marriage and family;” but also the about the support we give for engaged couples and the preparation that goes into that process of beginning a life of love for one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

As the Bishops explain, “marriage at every stage and encouragement for living family life as a domestic church” is what we celebrate. One way in our Parish to help promote such a great Sacrament is as a “Wedding Coordinator.” If you are interested in helping with such a wonderful Ministry as Lisa Parker and Kathy Vorpapel have done for years, call the Parish Office. In this way we follow the directive of our Bishops to always work to support and promote marriage and family life.

National Marriage Week ends Sunday February 14th, the Feast of St. Valentine. Valentine’s Day is World Marriage Day. What an appropriate way to celebrate St. Valentine a true Saint of the Catholic Church. What do we know about Valentine?

On February 14, around the year 270 A.D., Valentine, a holy priest in Rome in the days of Emperor Claudius II, was executed. It was under Claudius and soon after Diocletian that Roman Emperors took a great delight in killing Christians. Valentine lived in this period. Fifty years later Constantine would favor Christianity as the Religion of the people.

Under the rule of Claudius, Rome was involved in many unpopular and bloody campaigns. The emperor had to maintain a strong army, but was having a difficult time getting soldiers to join his military leagues. Claudius believed that Roman men were unwilling to join the army because of their strong attachment to their wives and families. To get rid of the problem, Claudius banned all marriages and engagements in Rome.

Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine’s actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death. Valentine was arrested and dragged before the Prefect of Rome, who condemned him to be beaten to death with clubs and to have his head cut off. The sentence was carried out on February 14, on or about the year 270. Sorry no little cherubs with arrows being shot through big red hearts, with little wings flapping. But his defense of the gift of Marriage and Young Love is why to this day he represents love but for the Catholic Community the Patron of Marriage.

Have a Blessed Valentine’s Day as we continue to support the power of Marriage, a Sacrament of the Church.



THE GIFT OF SUNDAY

Dear Parishioners, with all the issues of the Covid-19 directives and trying to celebrate our Catholic Faith our Archbishop has asked us to look at a reflection he wrote called “The Gift of Sunday.” I have put the link below along with a paragraph our Archbishop wrote.
