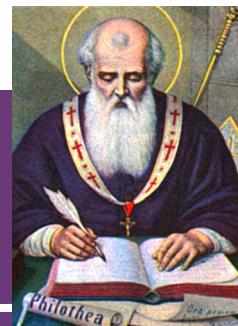


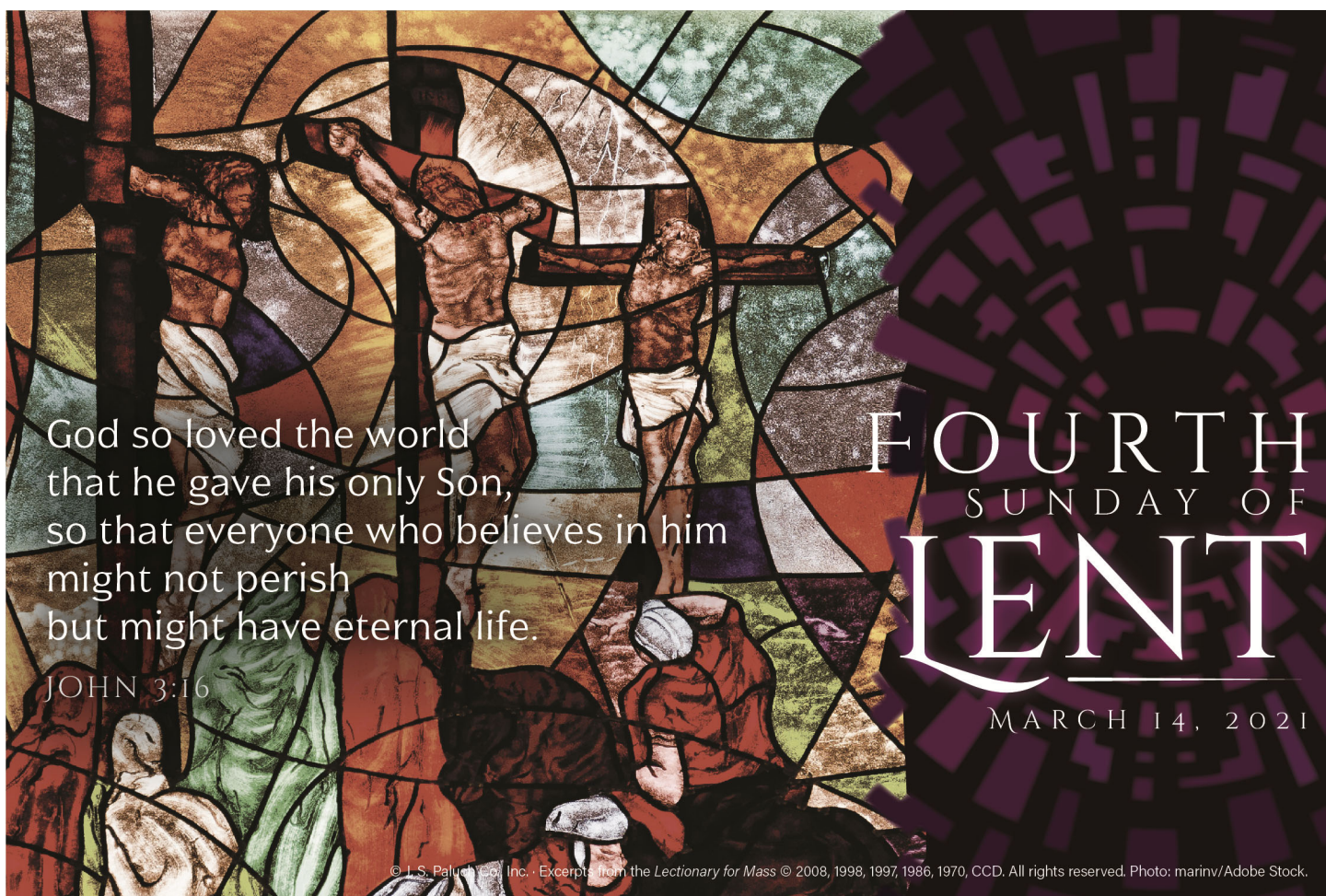

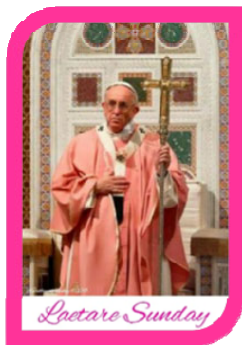

THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT: CALLED LAETARE SUNDAY

This Sunday receives its name from the Latin word for "rejoice." Many of us undoubtedly remember that this is the Sunday when rose is worn by the priest, when flowers once again decorate what was otherwise a barren sanctuary. A posture of joy may be the last thing many of us desire because of all the struggles and devastation with covid this last year. Many of us may still be experiencing isolation, longing for just a bit of contact with our neighbors and our friends. And yet, the Church calls us mourners to rejoice.



Christian joy does not mean denying the existence of sorrow. Rather, Christian joy is our recognition that the world is meaningful, a space created for love rather than meaningless hatred or despair. We lift up our heads to praise the living God, joyfully, because God has loved us into existence, redeemed us through the Death and Resurrection of the Son, and still is present through the power of the Holy Spirit, even as we suffer the minor and major tragedies of life.

Such rejoicing should not be a stoic disregard for the suffering so evident in our world. Rather, the rejoicing that breaks forth from our lips is the expression of hope. God is like a tender mother, who gathers her children into her arms, consoling us as a mom calms a newborn babe. We rejoice that this God exists. If we take up this posture of rejoicing, we may begin to see anew why there are reasons for us to rejoice now. Time spent with family (even if it's digitally mediated), concern for our neighbor, the sacrifice of many Americans for the common good, and even a deeper longing for the Eucharist that dwells in the hearts of so many Catholics unable to receive the Body and Blood of our Lord calls us to rejoice in that future Hope.

FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH: FRIDAY MARCH 19TH

Saint Joseph's Day, March 19 is, in Italy, also Father's Day—which isn't at all surprising as St. Joseph was, of course, the earthly father of Jesus. This feast and festival—which always falls in the midst of Lent—is especially commemorated and celebrated in Italy in general and Sicily in particular.



The tradition of the “St. Joseph Table” of food has its origins in Sicily. Legends from the Middle Ages attributed the end of a devastating drought to a prayer-devotion that the Sicilian people made to St. Joseph. This celebration is a symbolic “thank you” and renewal of the Sicilian people's devotion to Saint Joseph. It is a *shared* celebration with the entire community where the riches of food are given as alms to the poor: Traditional etiquette is that *no one* can be turned away from this table. As it is a *living* tradition, it has many interpreters and many food entries have been added and deleted along the way but two constants remain: no meat and sesame-coated breads in symbolic shapes.

A St. Joseph's Day “Table” is a makeshift dinner-festival held in one's home, or more recently a church hall. The host family or creates what amounts to a kinetic work of art. This table is rife with symbolism, particularly the decorative breads. Sicilian bakers sprinkle copious amounts of sesame seeds—which resemble and symbolize teardrops—on the many different types of St. Joseph's Day breads. The breads themselves are made from the same dough that forms Italian bread.

The St. Joseph's Day table, in addition to the breads above, contains a plethora of non-meat dishes due to the fact that St. Joseph's Day always falls during the penitential season of Lent, and meat is forbidden on the Fridays between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday. The very first “greens” of springtime, dandelions and *cardones*, are sprinkled on pizza. Fish and seafood from both the Mediterranean and Adriatic Seas, especially anchovies and sardines, are served on Focaccia, and Biscotti. Other St. Joseph's Day staples include eggplant Caponata, excellent for dipping with Italian bread; as well as Pasta con Sarde, Egg frittas, bean dishes, olives, and especially lentils.

Beautiful as the Saint Joseph's Day Table is to behold, it is a practical work of art: it is meant to feed not only friends and relatives but, traditionally, to feed the hungry strangers, those who *cannot* host their own Table either due to poverty or a particularly bad harvest in their family or having run out of food over the wintertime. Stunning to behold and delicious to partake in, a Saint Joseph's Day Table is a tradition which is still carried on to this day. As one famous Italian said, “Perhaps the fact that it is not as well-known as Saint Patrick's day corned-beef-and-cabbage is that it emphasizes “food” over “drink”. This would be a great Thing to do with Friends this Year!

HOLY WEEK

All of our Holy week celebrations will be bi-lingual with Fr. Gil and Fr. Bernardo who help serve our Hispanic Community joining us for these wonderful celebrations. Just a reminder that because of the Covid-restrictions that are still in place for Holy Week as directed by the Archdiocese rituals such as the "Washing of the Feet" will be eliminated for the general community. The presentations of the oils will be placed on the Altar area on Holy Thursday.

The Veneration of the Cross on Good Friday has two ways offered by the Archdiocese neither of which allows the kissing or touching of the Cross. Consequently, one form has the whole community venerating from the pews at the same moment in time. The other has ushers directing people to come up to an area that will be marked and either genuflect or bow from a distance. We are leaning to the second form. Those details will be worked out by our Liturgy Committee.

Finally, the Easter Vigil will be limited in some of its rituals. Partially because the lack of a Catechumen this Vigil because of not being able to truly gather. We also have added an additional Mass on Easter Sunday. We will keep you updated on all the changes and plans. We hope all of you continue to have a wonderful Lenten Season.

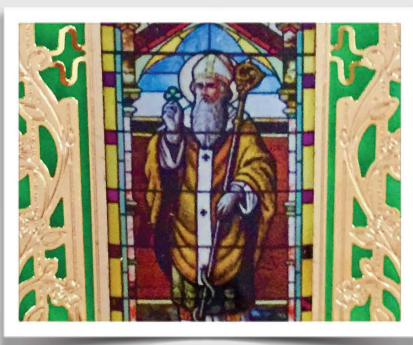

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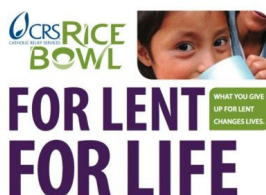
